Bacteria can enter the mouth and cause a sore throat.

This may develop into rheumatic fever.

Rheumatic fever is much more likely if a person does not get enough food or lives in overcrowded conditions. White blood cells in the body make protein molecules to kill the bacteria causing rheumatic fever. However, sometimes these molecules attack heart valves, making them leaky.



People who have this leaky valve often have these symptoms:


- · they get out of breath easily
