Fig. 7.1 shows the average number of deaths due to bowel cancer depending on age in the UK.

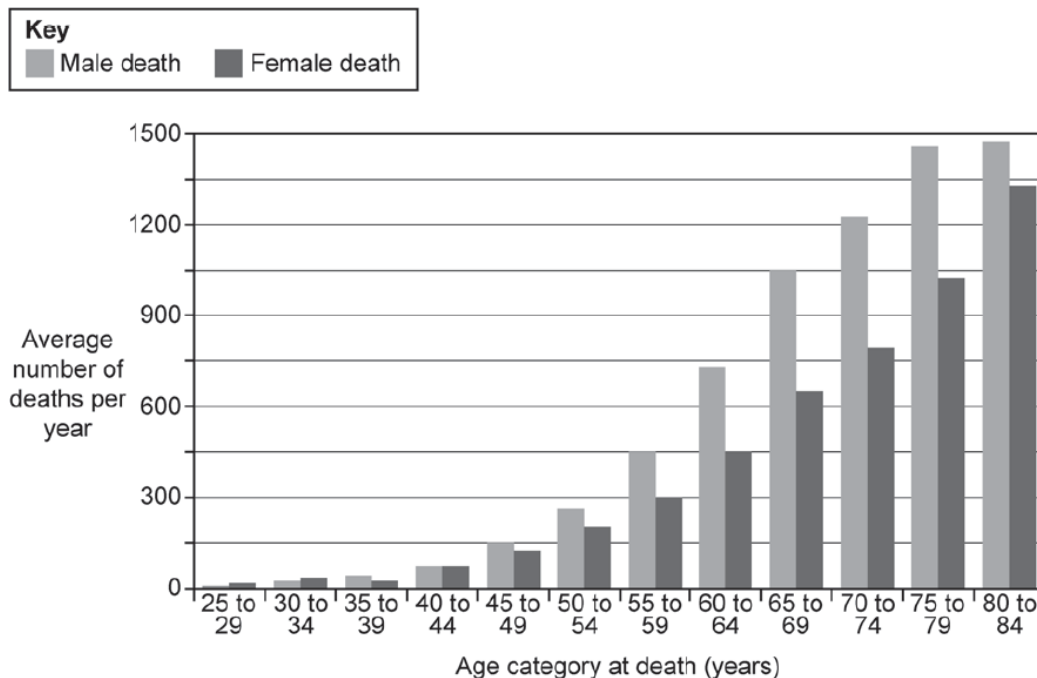

processed meat	13
being overweight	11
drinking excess alcohol	6
smoking	7
ionising radiation	2
lack of physical activity	5
eating too little fibre	28
