


Question Set 8

- (ii) The reaction of 2-chloropropene with steam requires a catalyst. State a suitable catalyst for this reaction. Concept rat ed sulfuric acid
- (b) 2-Chloropropene can be polymerised to form poly(2-chloropropene).
 - (i) Write a balanced equation for the formation of this polymer.
