#### Formula list

#### Area and volume formulae

Where r is the radius of the sphere or cone, l is the slant height of a cone and h is the perpendicular height of a cone:

Curved surface area of a cone =  $\pi rl$ 

Surface area of a sphere = 
$$4\pi r^2$$

Volume of a sphere = 
$$\frac{4}{3} \pi r^3$$

Volume of a cone = 
$$\frac{1}{3} \pi r^2 h$$


### Kinematics formulae

Where a is constant acceleration, u is initial velocity, v is final velocity, s is displacement from the position when t=0 and t is time taken:

$$v = u + at$$

$$s = ut + \frac{1}{2}at^2$$


$$v^2 = u^2 + 2as$$

Calculate the width of the enlarged rectangle.


Or just rutingle width = 54/2 = 4.5 cm[3]
