


Calculate the height, hcm, of the trapezium.




(a) Write vector a as a column vector.

- When the weather is wet the probability that he cycles to school is 0.3.
- When the weather is dry the probability that he cycles to school is 0.8.

The information is shown on this tree diagram.

(a) it is dry and Adam walks to school,
