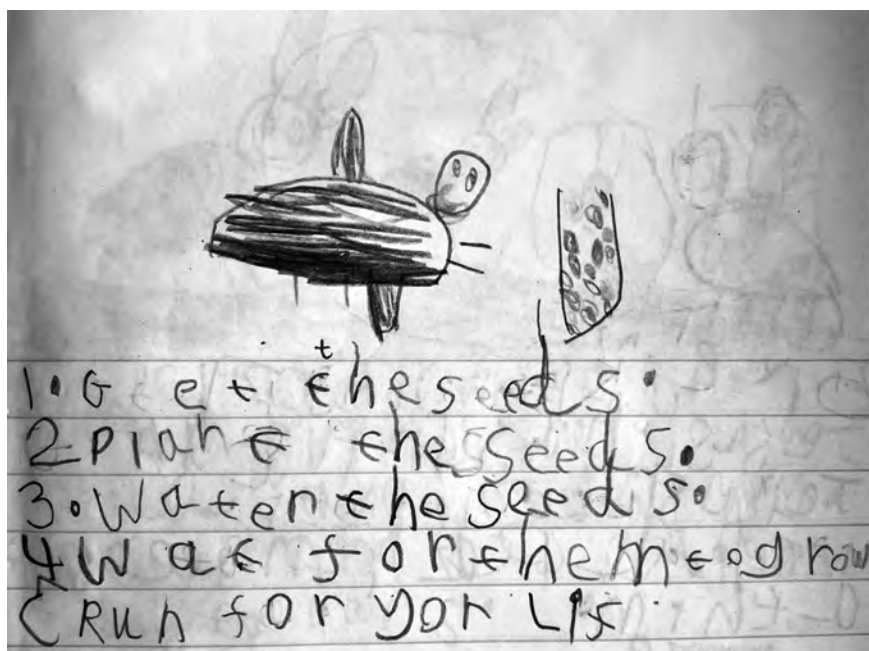
Texts A, B, C and D were produced at school by Celine between the ages of 5 years 3 months and 6 years 2 months.
