Sales of the global transnational corporation LEGO Group, 2017–2021, by world region

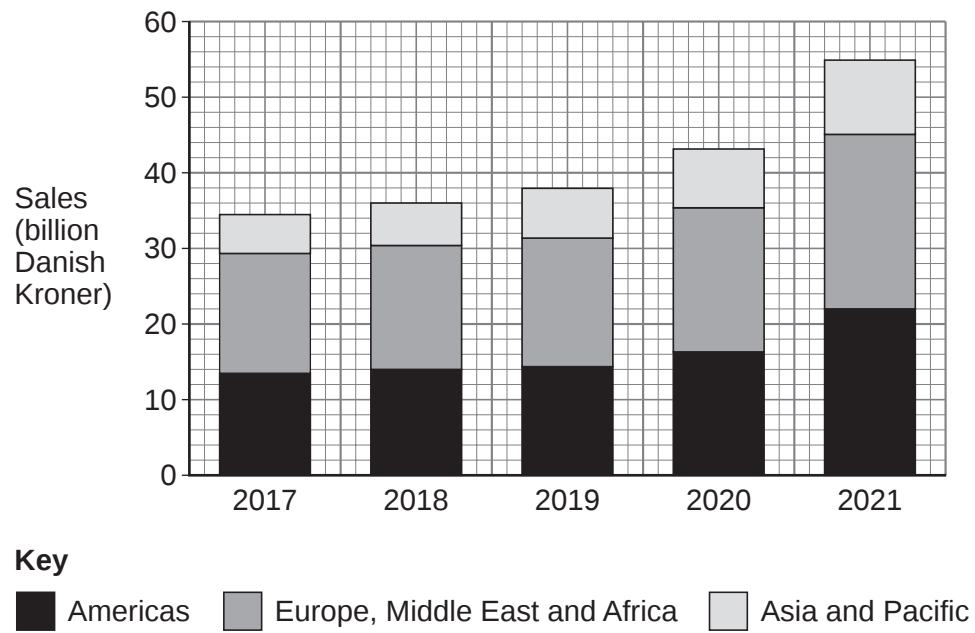
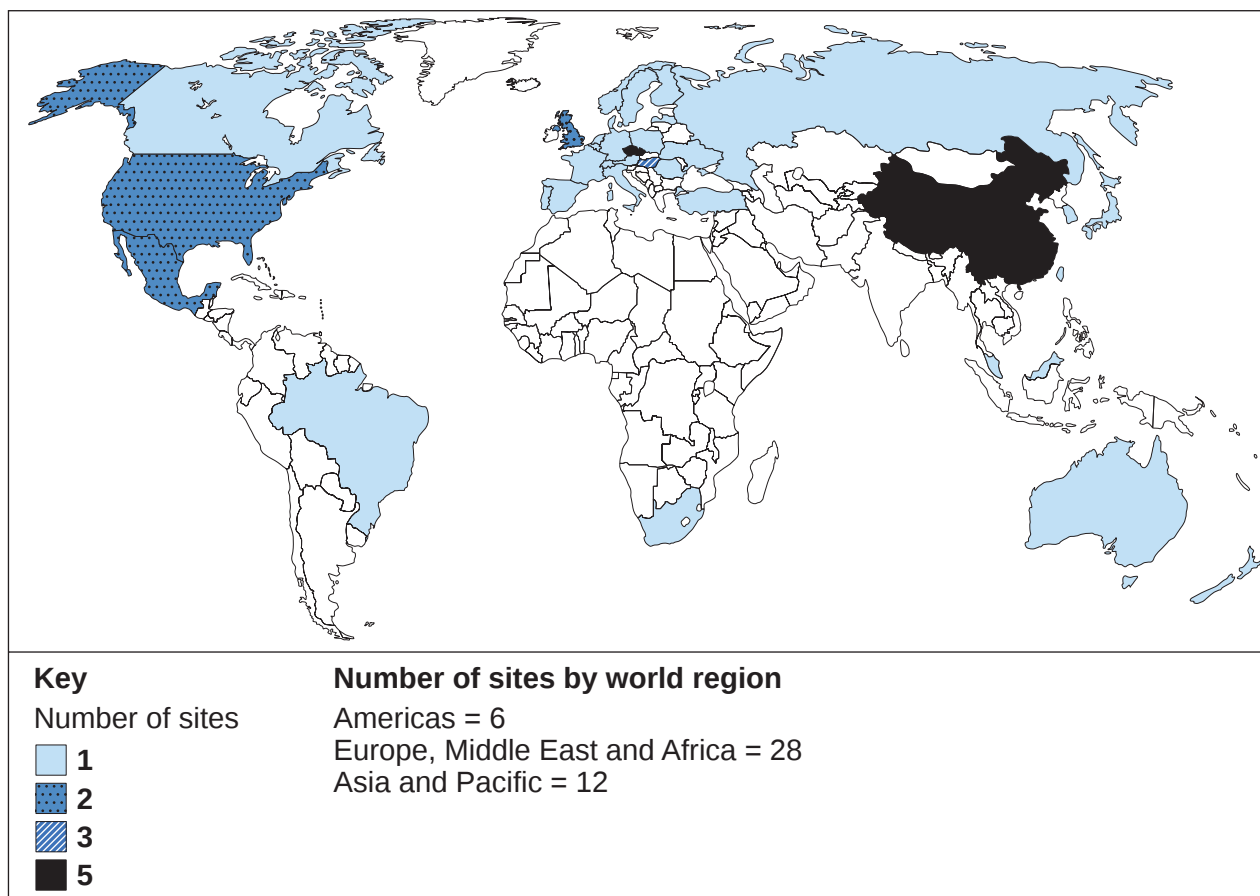

A map of Royal Palm Yacht and Country Club, a fortress development in Florida, USA

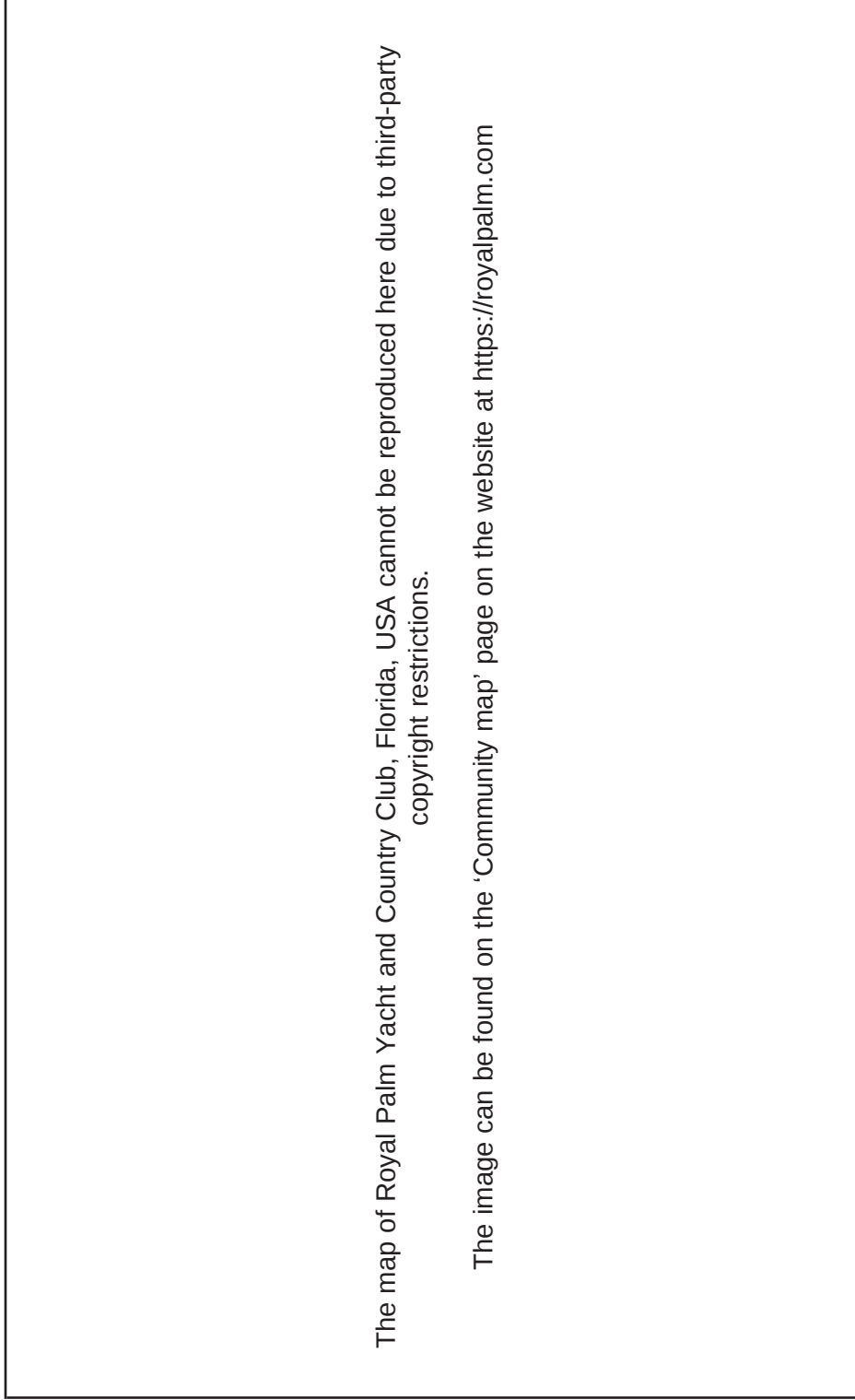


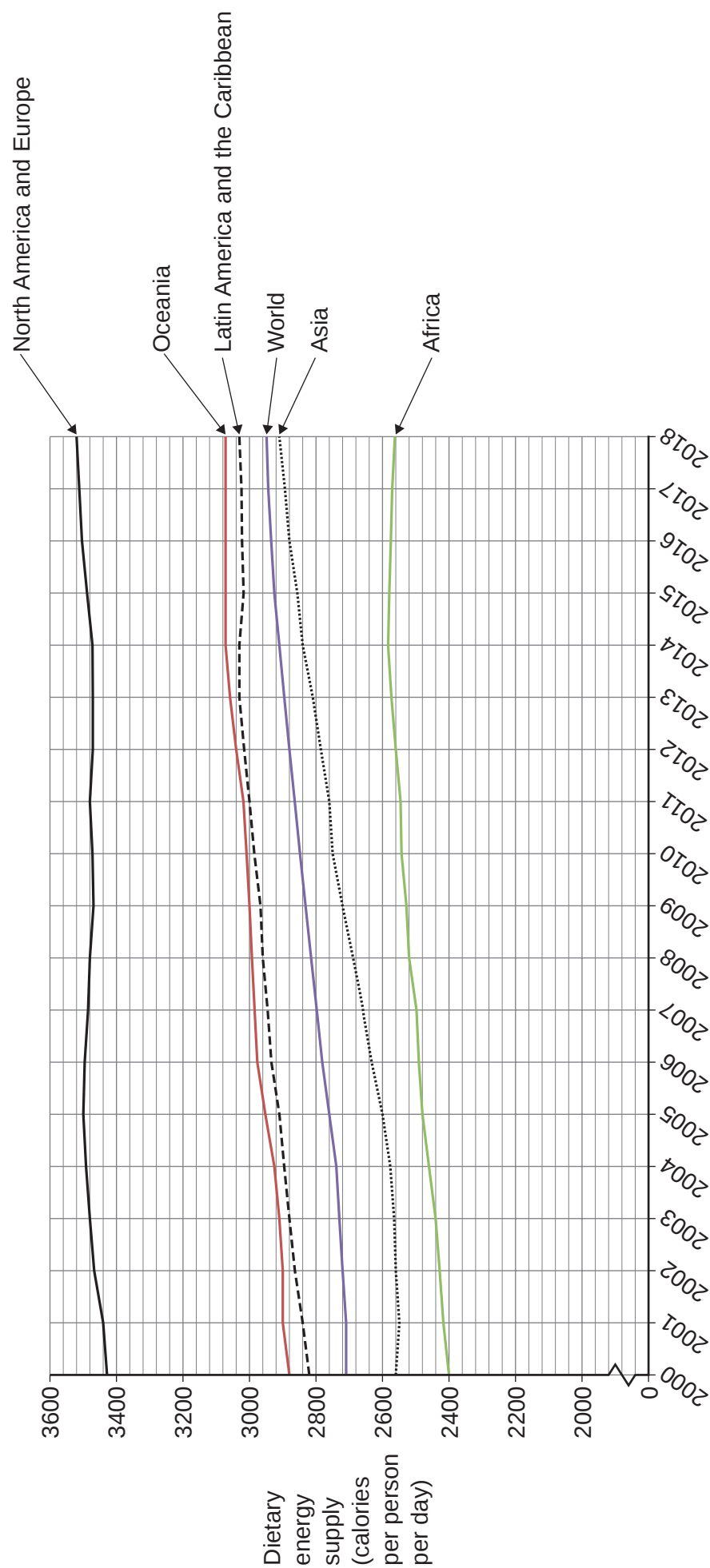

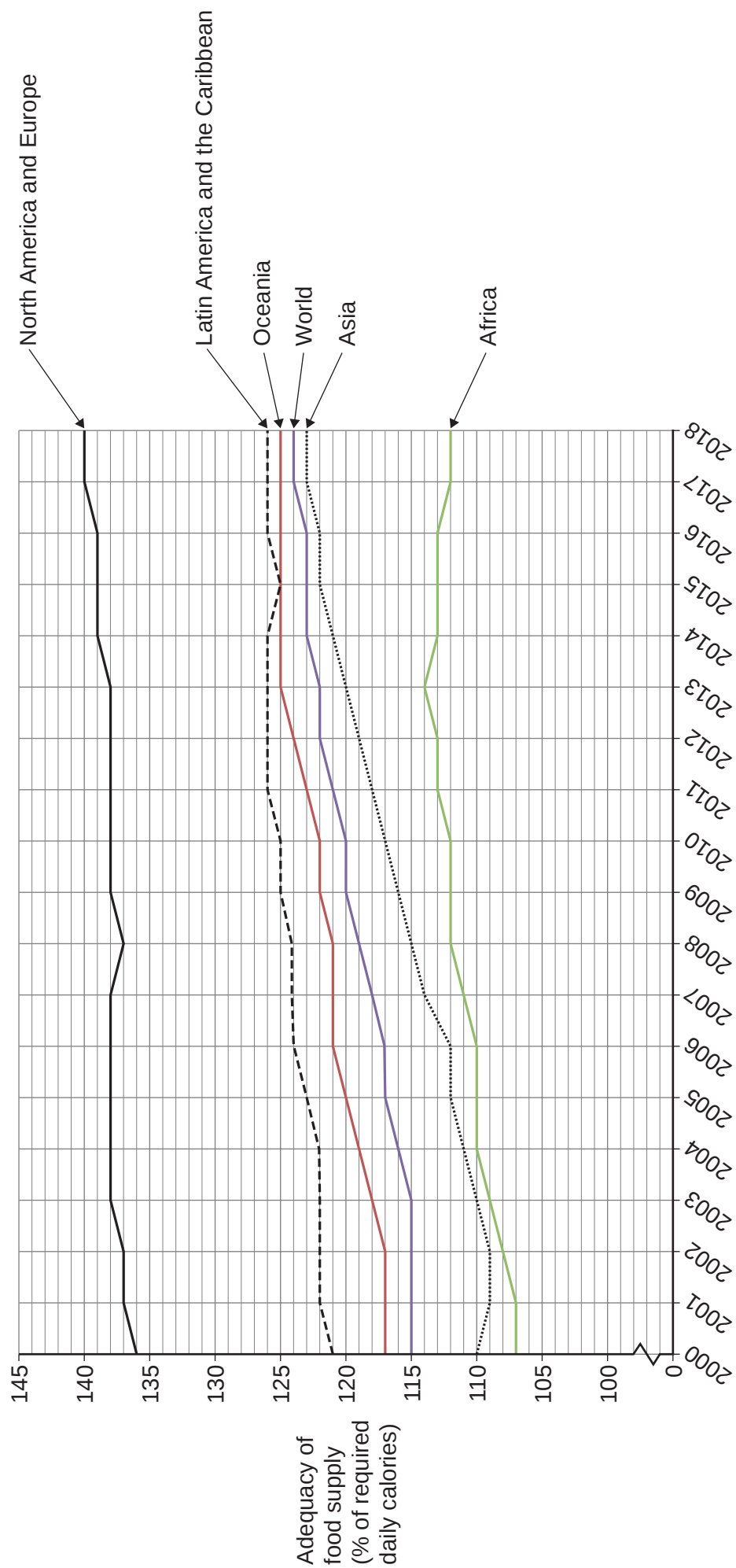
Average dietary energy supply in world regions from 2000 to 2018

(the number of births per woman) in selected countries in 1980 and 2010**

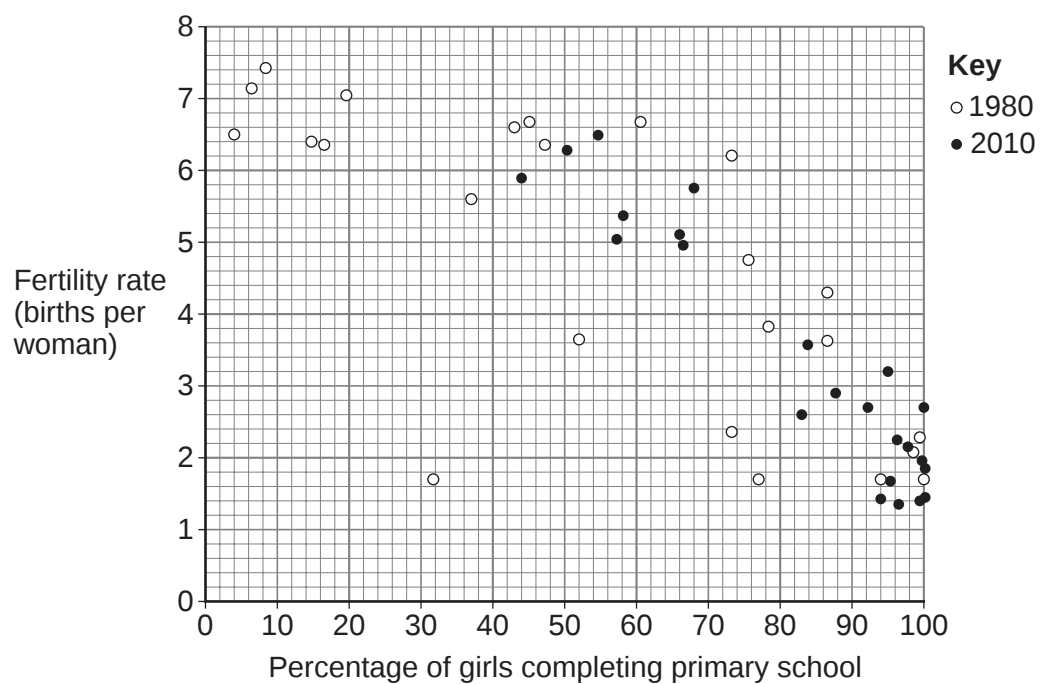

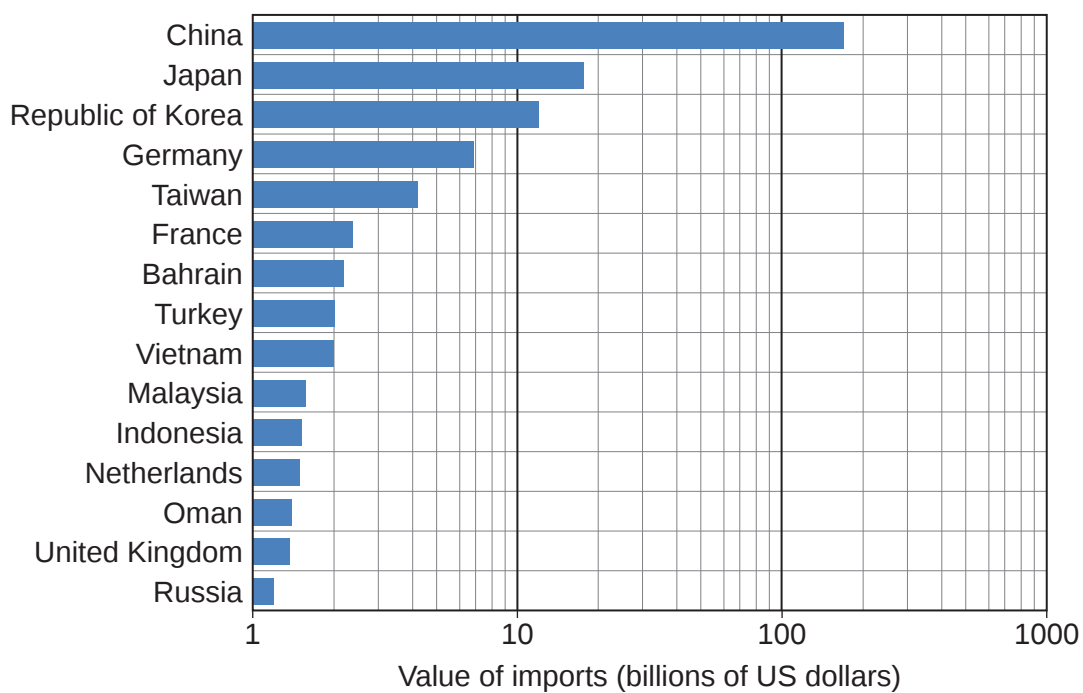
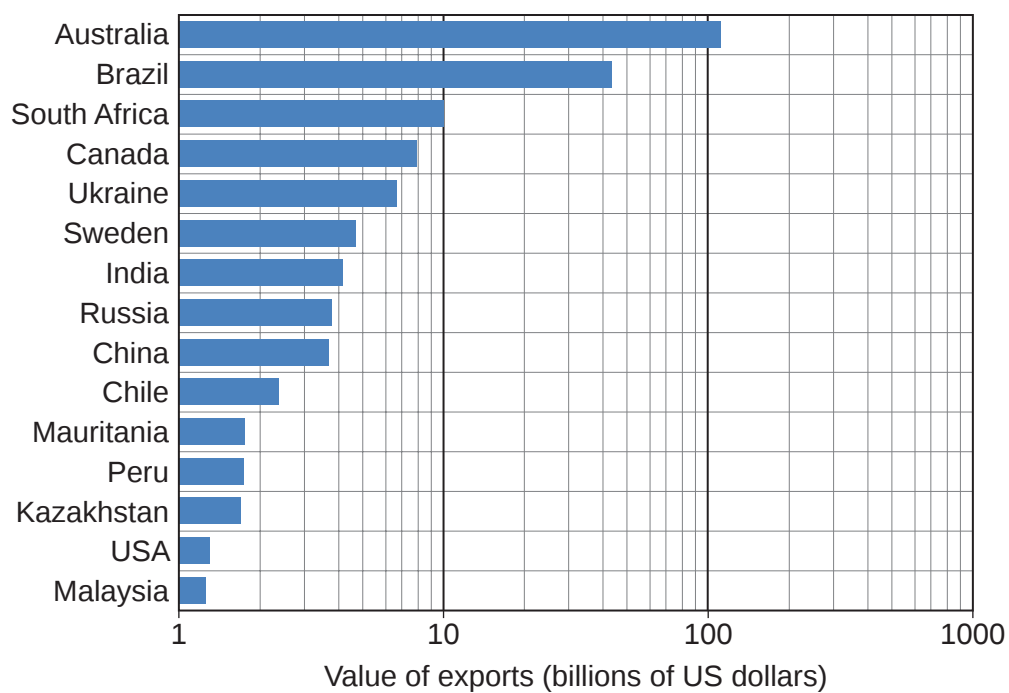
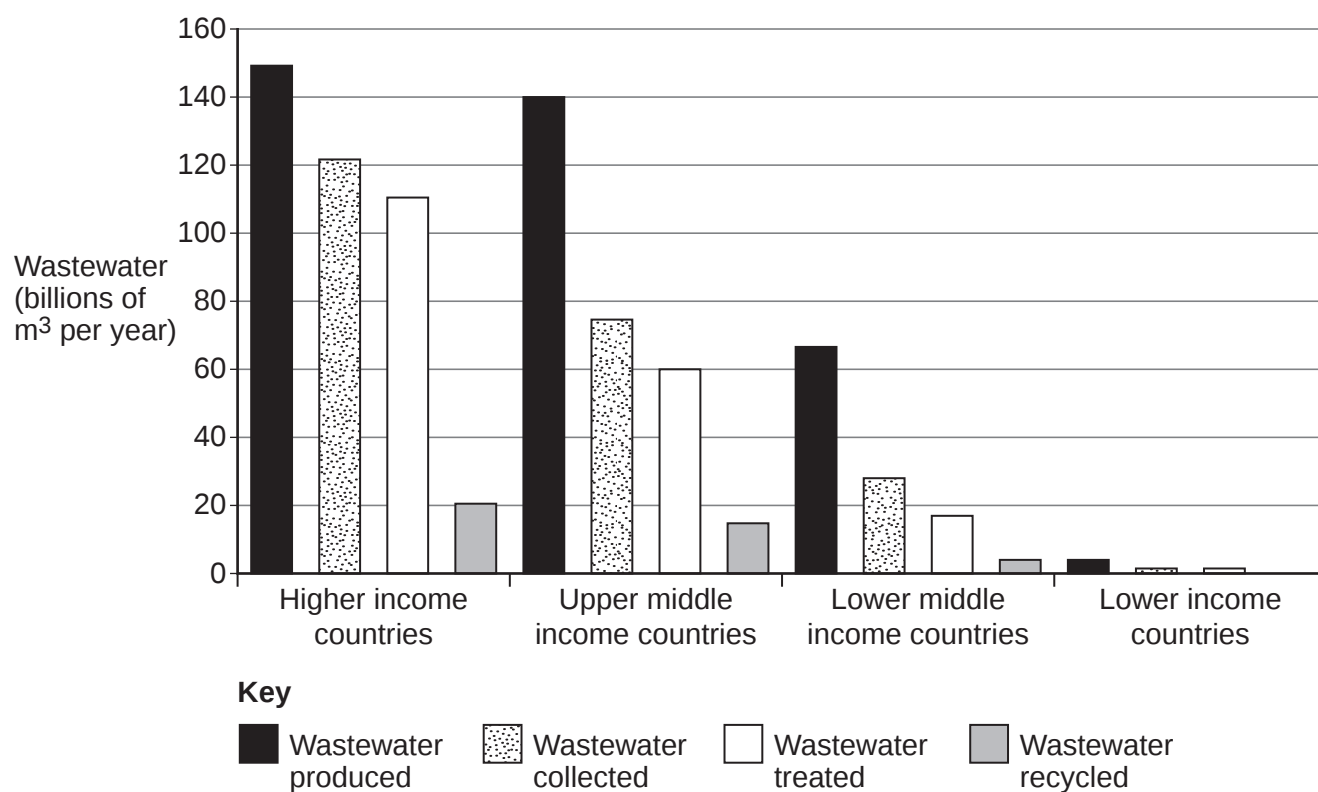
Figure 9a**The value of iron ore imported by the 15 largest importers in 2021****Figure 9b****The value of iron ore exported by the 15 largest exporters in 2021**

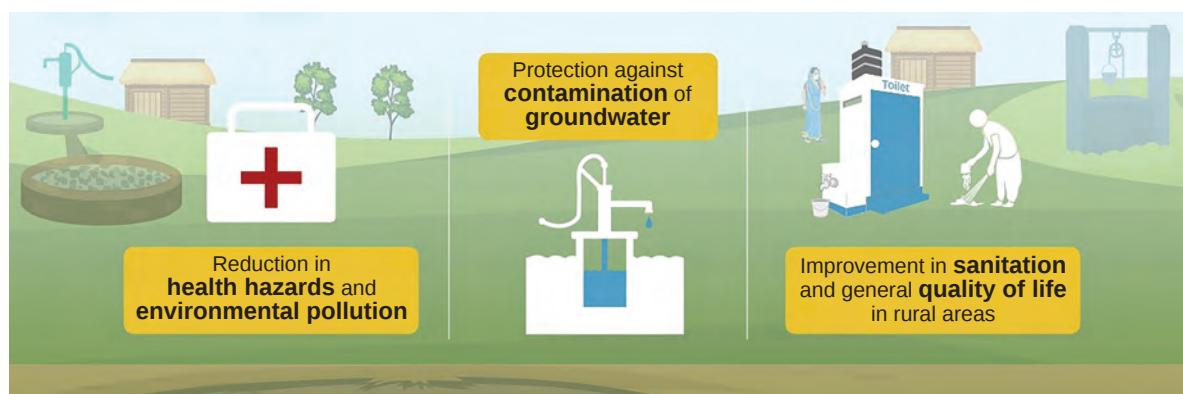
The amount and management of wastewater for countries at different income levels
