Global surface air pressure (mb) for one month

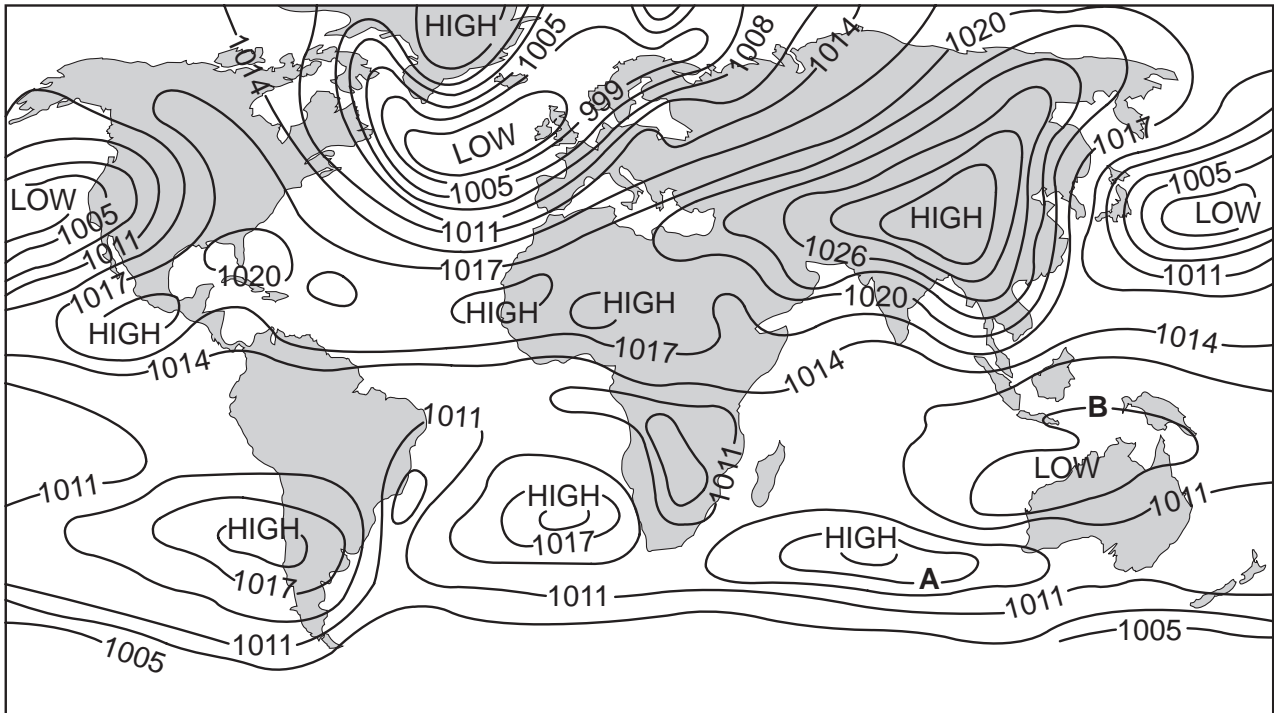

The dominant type of weathering in different climates

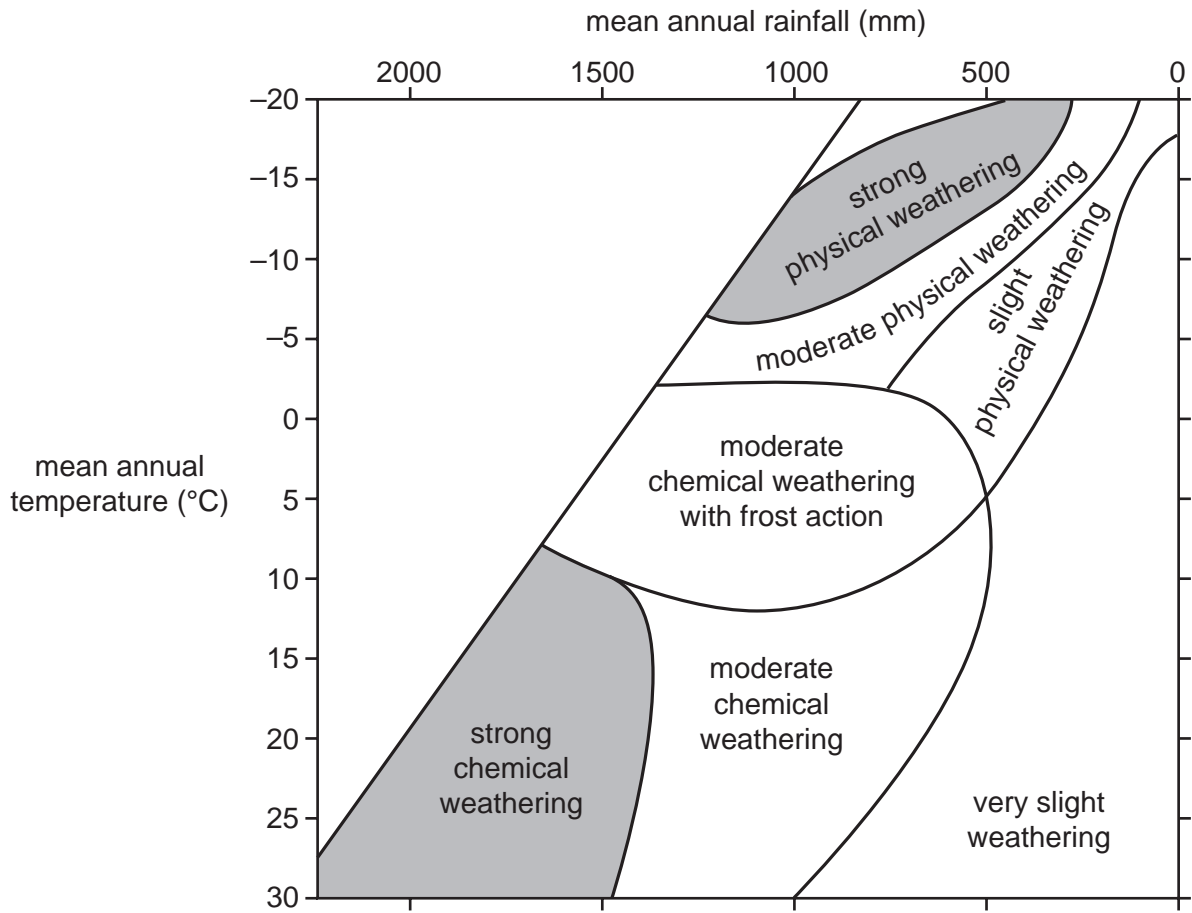

Migration between an urban area and a rural area in 1970 and 2012

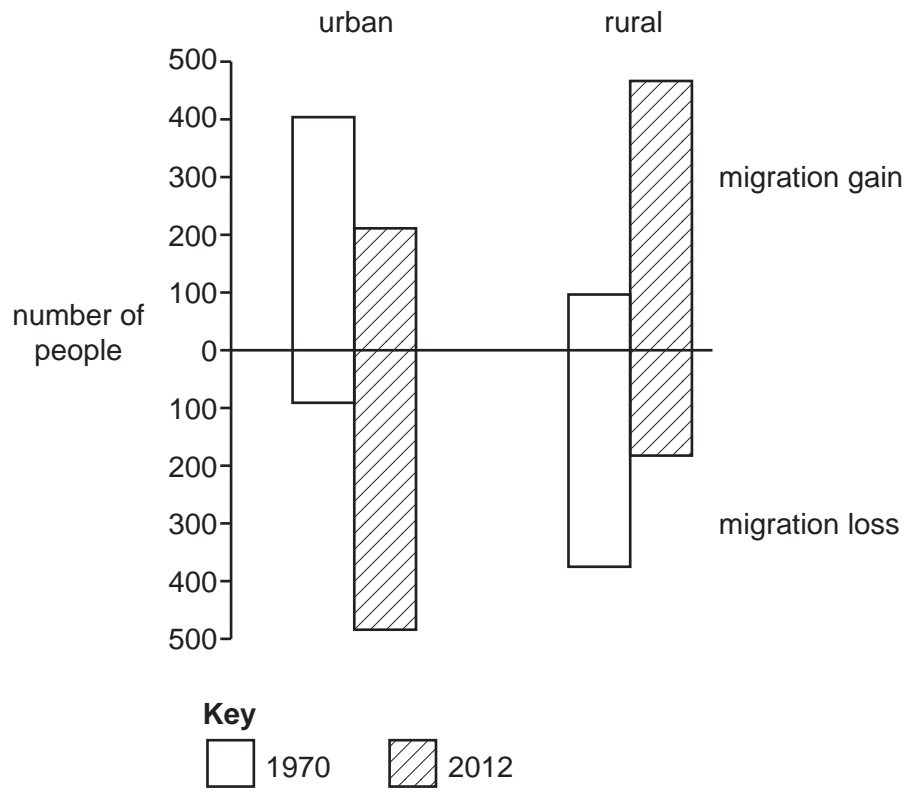
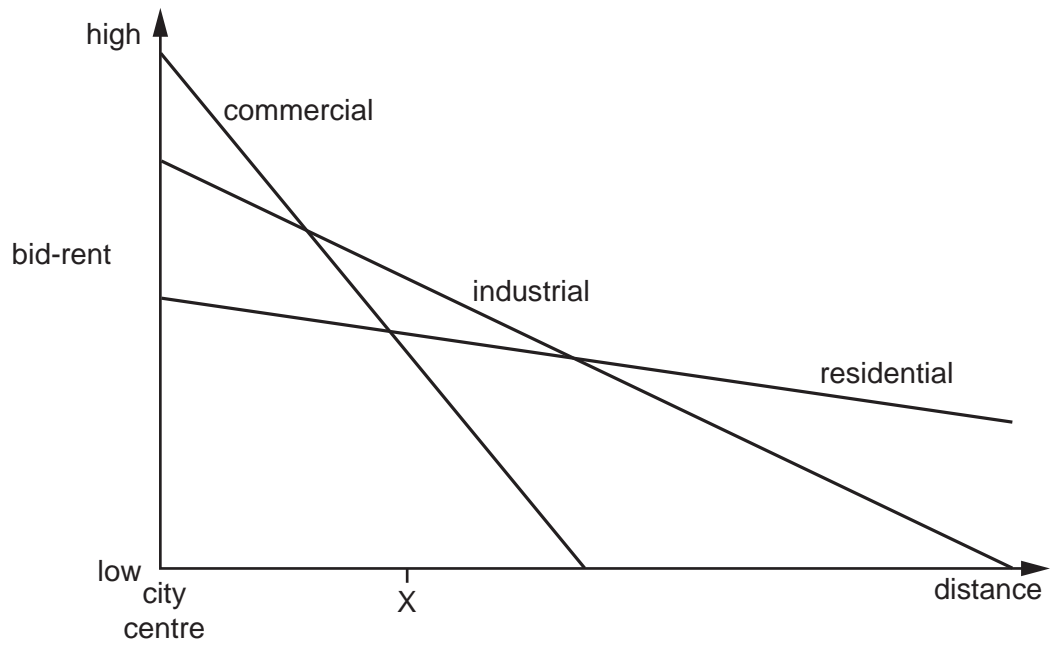
