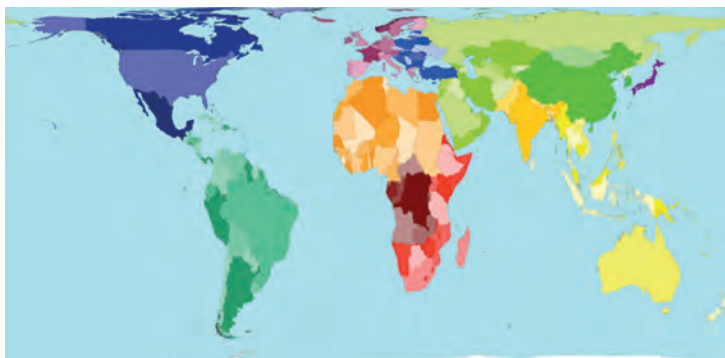

Fig. 1 for Question 1**Tractors in use, by country, 2006**

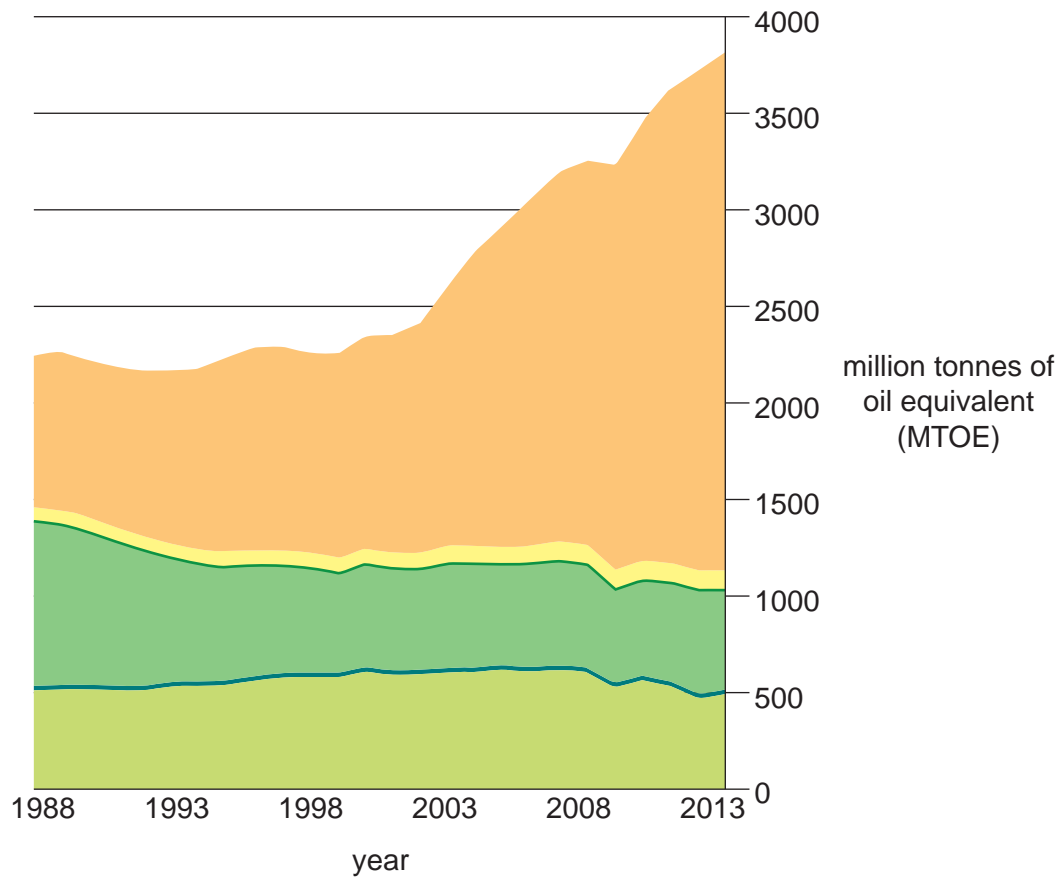
The mapping technique used above shows a country's land area in proportion to the number of tractors in use there. The inset map below shows a conventional world map for comparison.

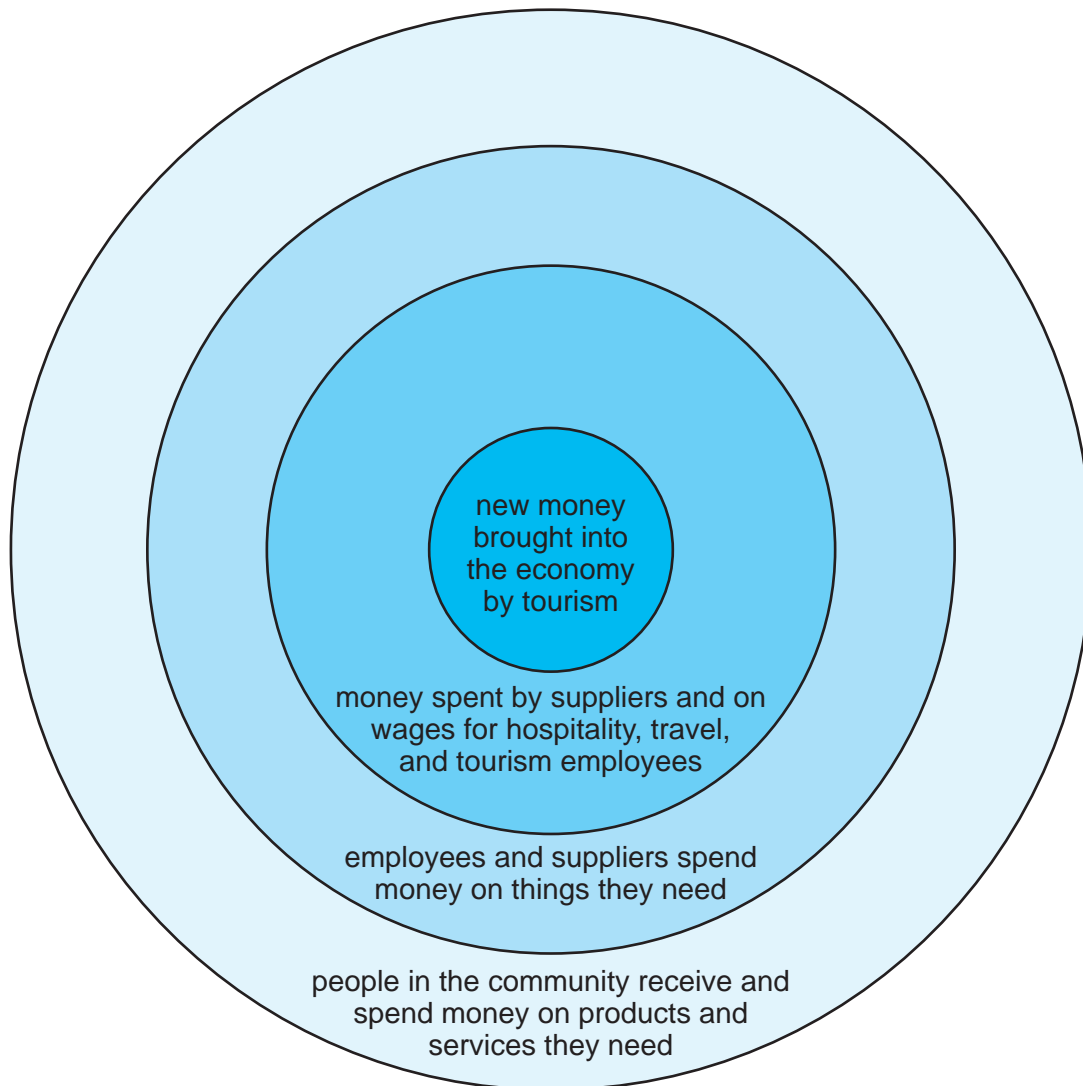

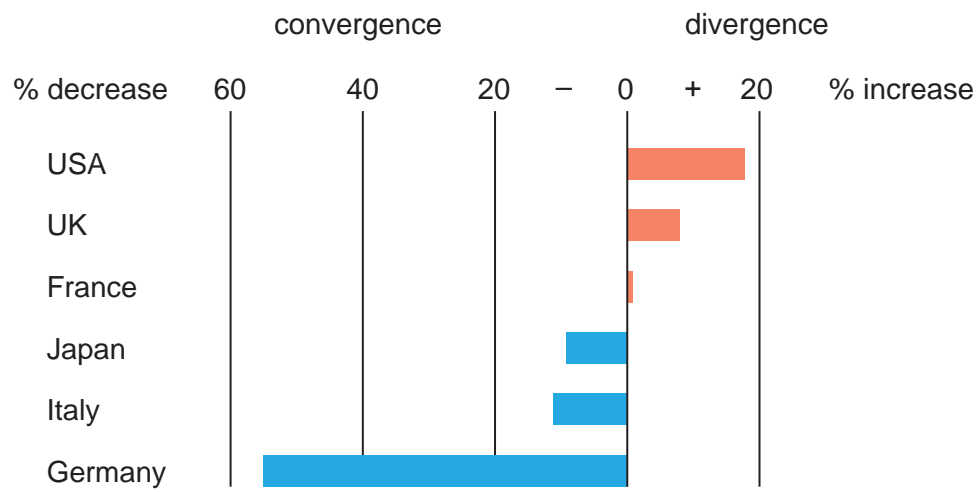
