Birth rate and death rate for selected countries, 1990 to 2019

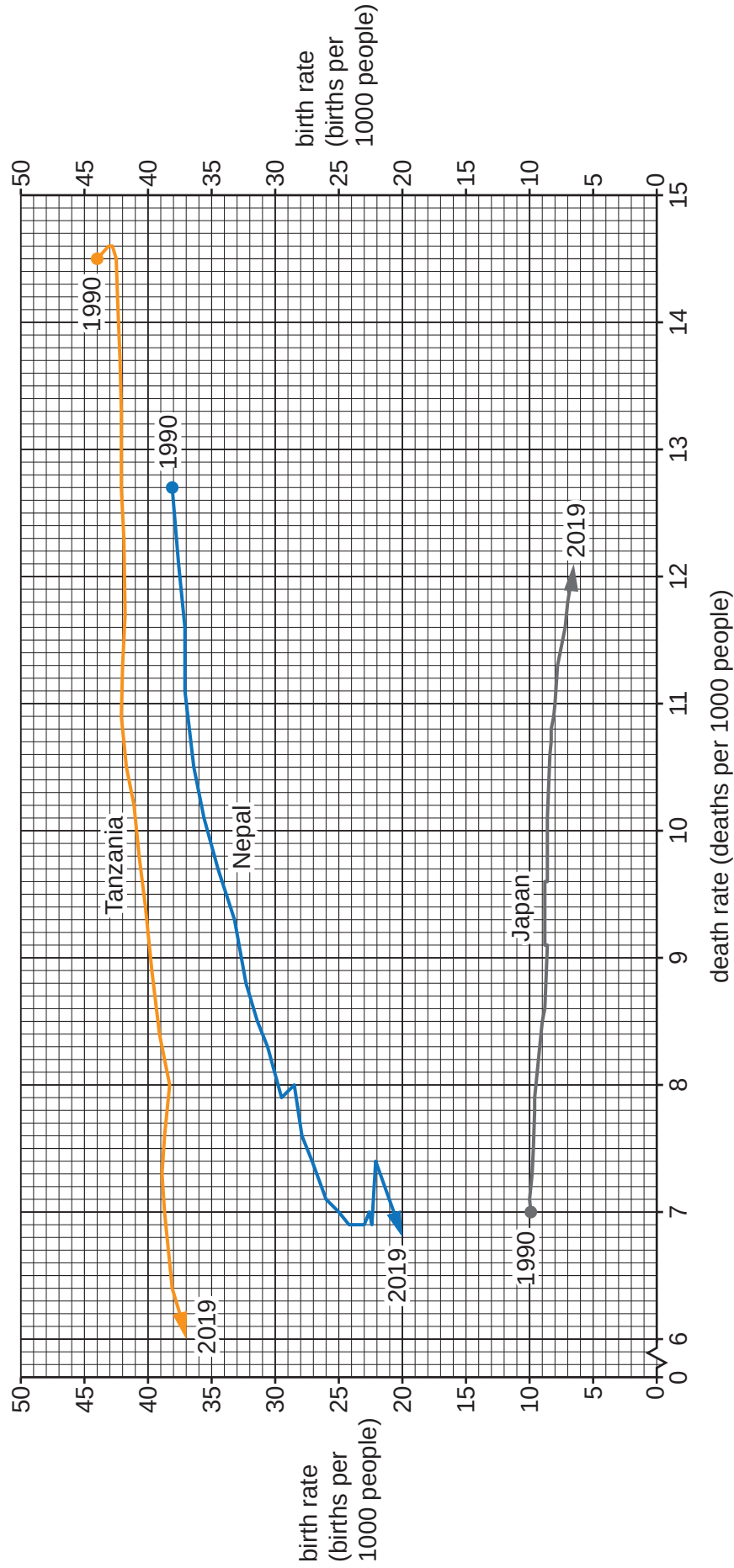
