an HIC in Europe, 2012–17

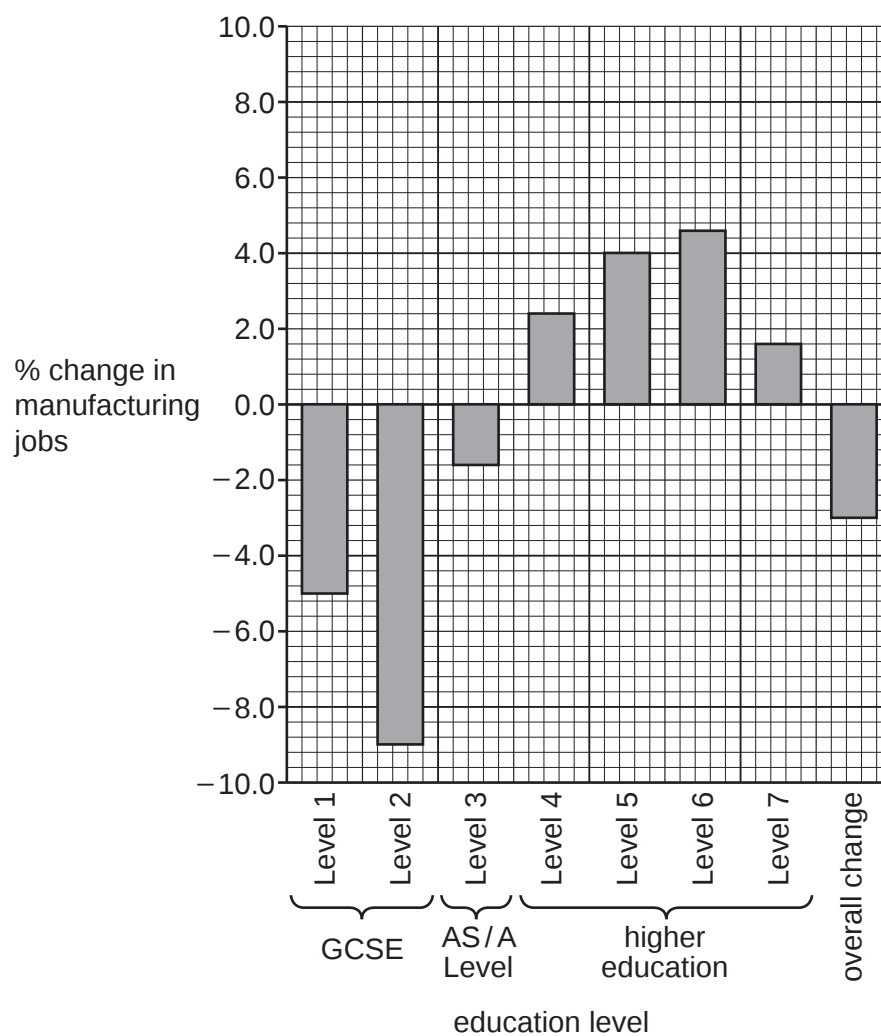
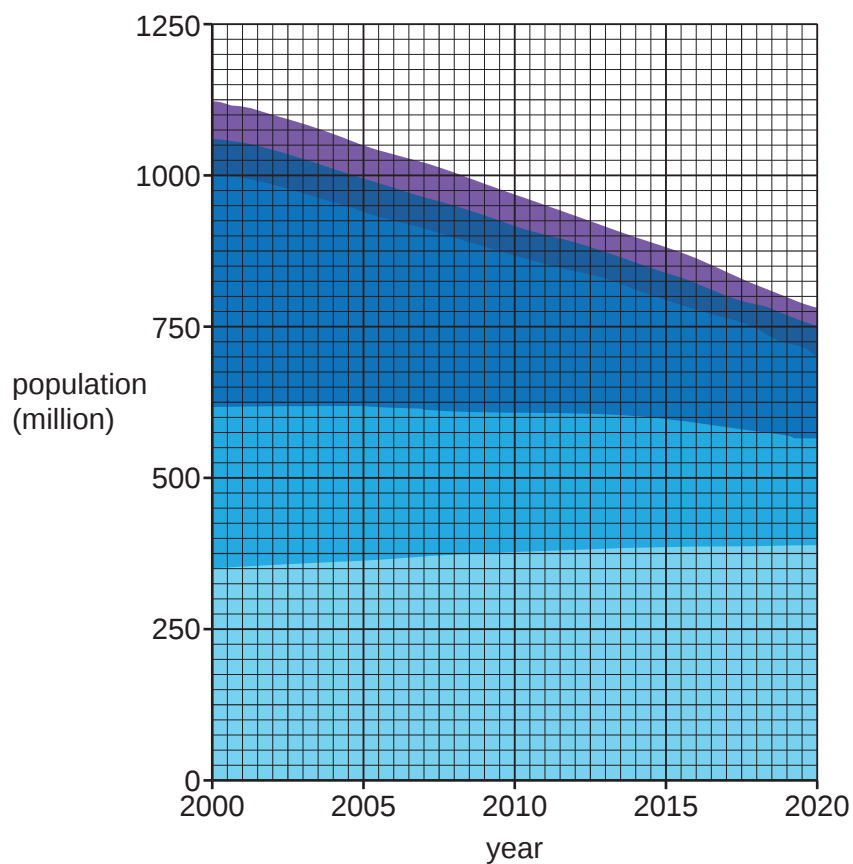

**Key**

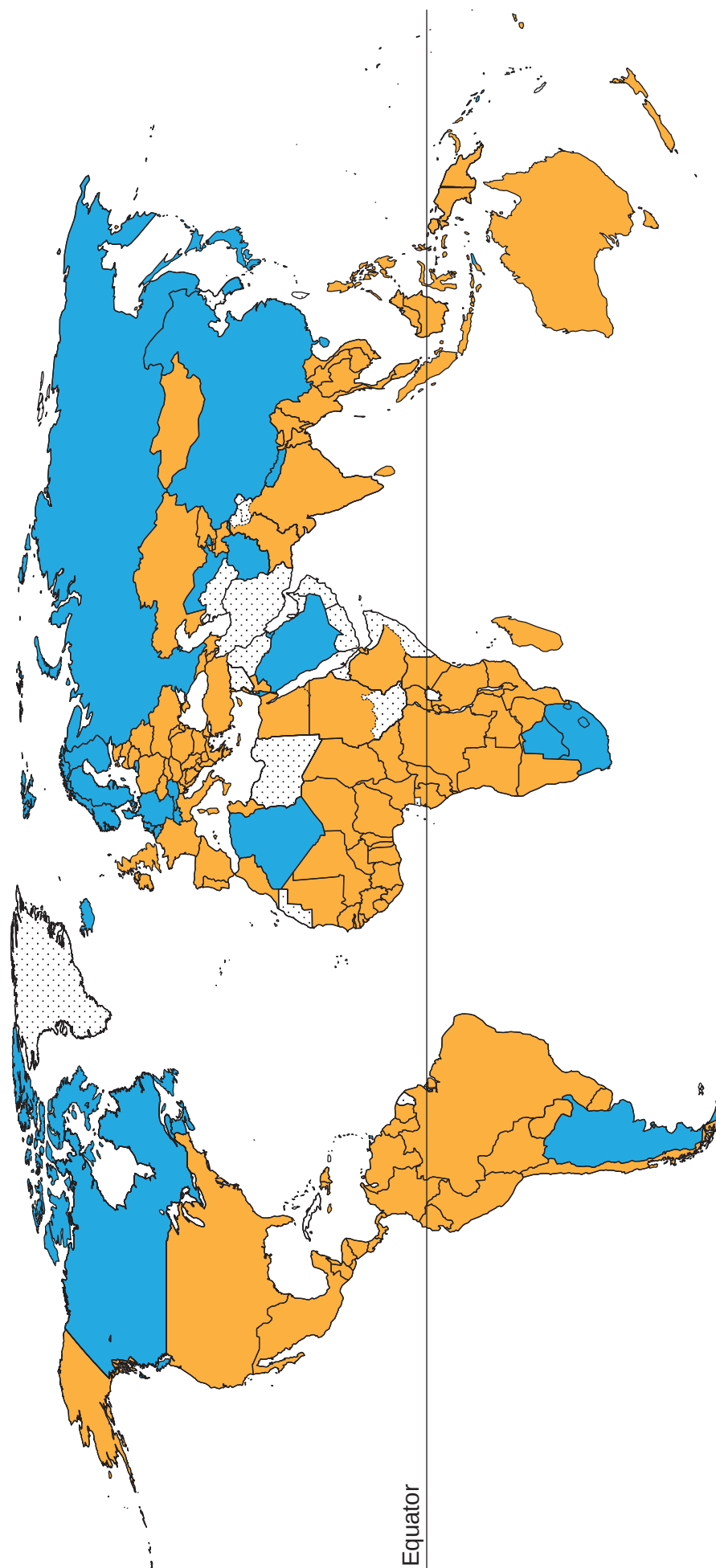

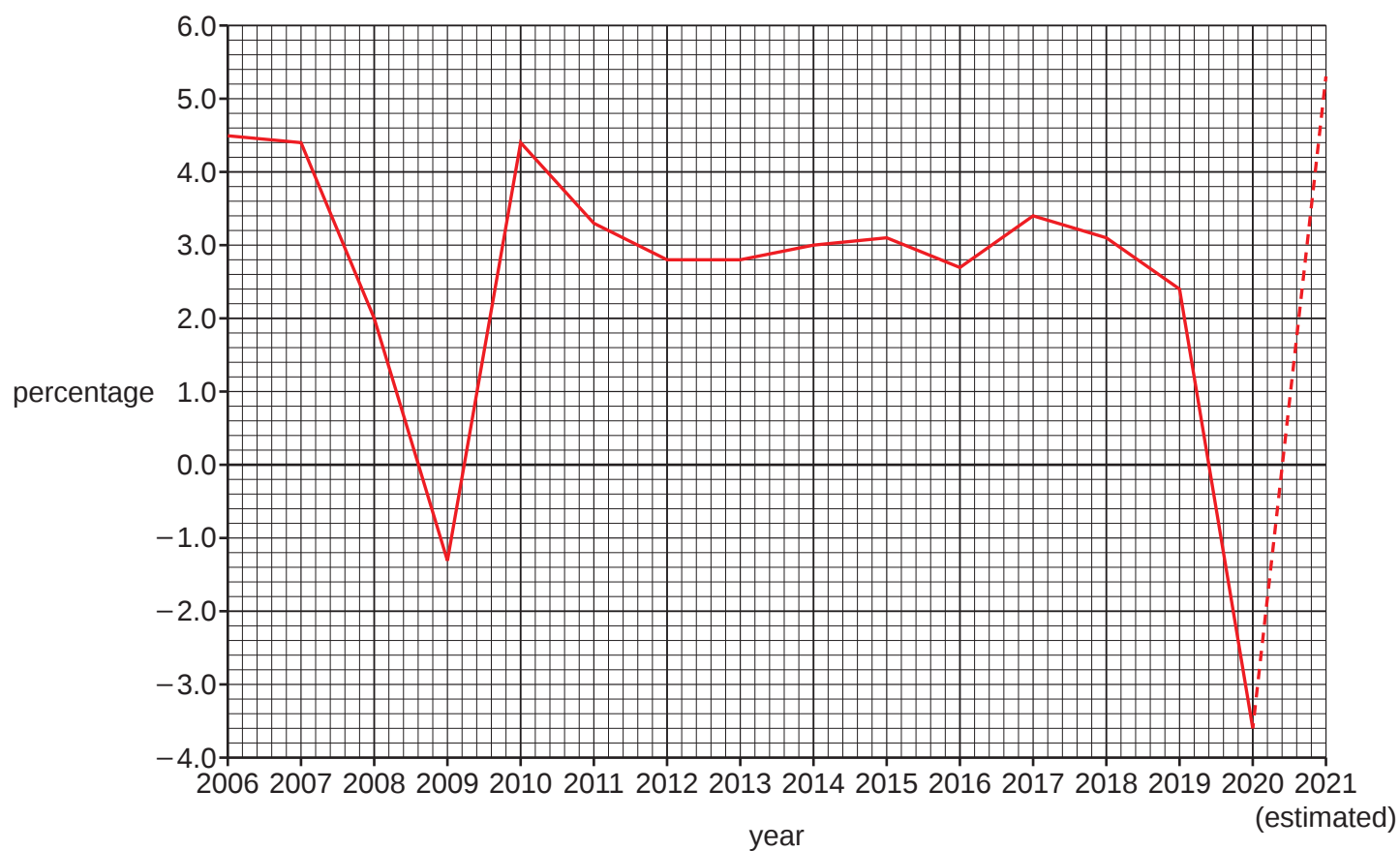
