



Fig. 1.1 for Question 1

^{*}El Niño is a local warming of surface waters in the equatorial zone of the Pacific Ocean that affects global atmospheric circulation.

On the map: Dry indicates drought. Wet indicates unusually high rainfall. Warm indicates abnormally high temperatures. Cool indicates abnormally low temperatures.



Percentage change in international tourist arrivals for the world and world regions, 2014 and 2015



The 2020-Seven countries are Chile, China, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Philippines and Poland.

The G7 countries are Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, UK and USA.

BRICS are Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa.
