Environmental Issues

Answer **one** of the following questions.

Earth hazards

- 8 Assess the extent to which primary rather than secondary impacts are the more serious effects arising from volcanic eruptions. [30]

Ecosystems and environments under threat

- 9 Assess the degree to which human activity has unintended consequences for a local ecosystem/environment. [30]
- 10 To what extent can physical environments be managed to ensure sustainability? [30]

Climatic hazards

- 11 To what extent are the impacts of tropical storms more than just environmental? [30]
- 12 Evaluate strategies used to reduce the impacts of climatic hazards. [30]

Economic Issues

Answer **one** of the following questions.

Population and resources

- 13 To what extent do changes in technology and society result in changes in the definition of resources? [30]
- 14 Evaluate the relative significance to population change of social, economic and political factors. [30]

Globalisation

- 15 Assess the extent to which globalisation brings advantages only to MEDCs. [30]
- 16 Evaluate the role of international trade agreements in influencing global patterns of production. [30]

Development and inequalities

- 17 'The level of economic development influences the quality of life.' Discuss. [30]
- 18 With reference to **one** named country, assess the degree to which inequalities within it have been reduced. [30]
