Fig. 1 – Sand movements in the coastal system between Winterton and Thorpeness, East Anglia, UK




Fig. 2 – Surface profiles of the Obrucheve glacier for 1963 and 2008




Fig. 3 – Suspended sediment in Wadi El Hammam





Fig. 4a – UK Economic Growth, 1979–2019



Fig. 4b – OS 1:25 000 map extract of Buxton, Derbyshire





