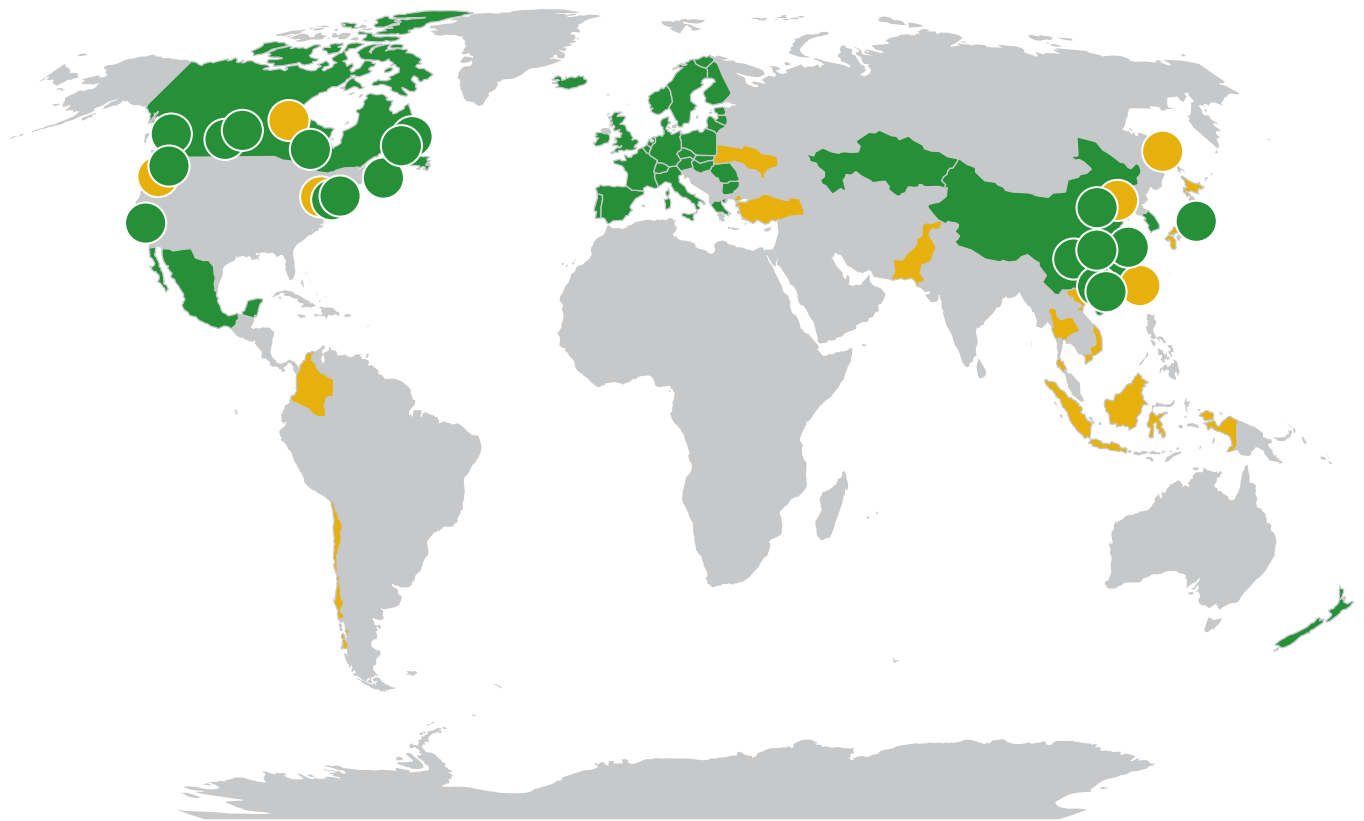

Fig. 2 – Infectious and deadly diseases

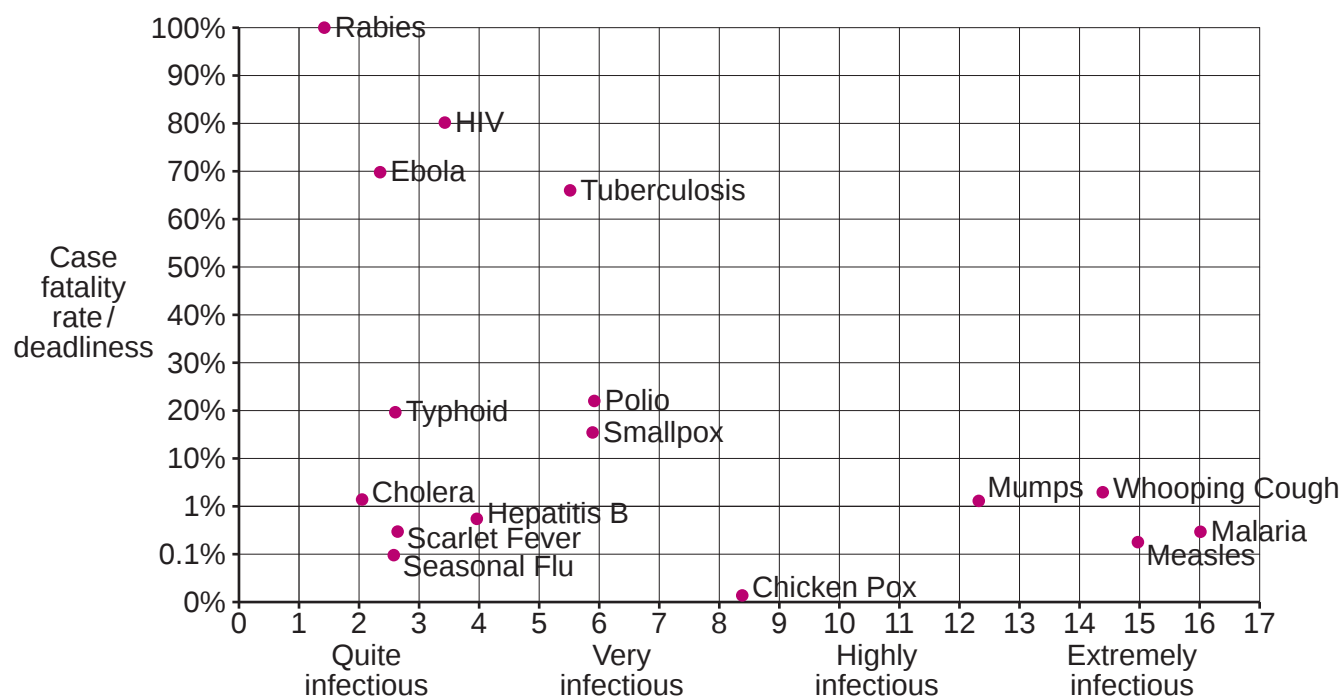


Fig. 3 – Food web in an inter-tidal zone

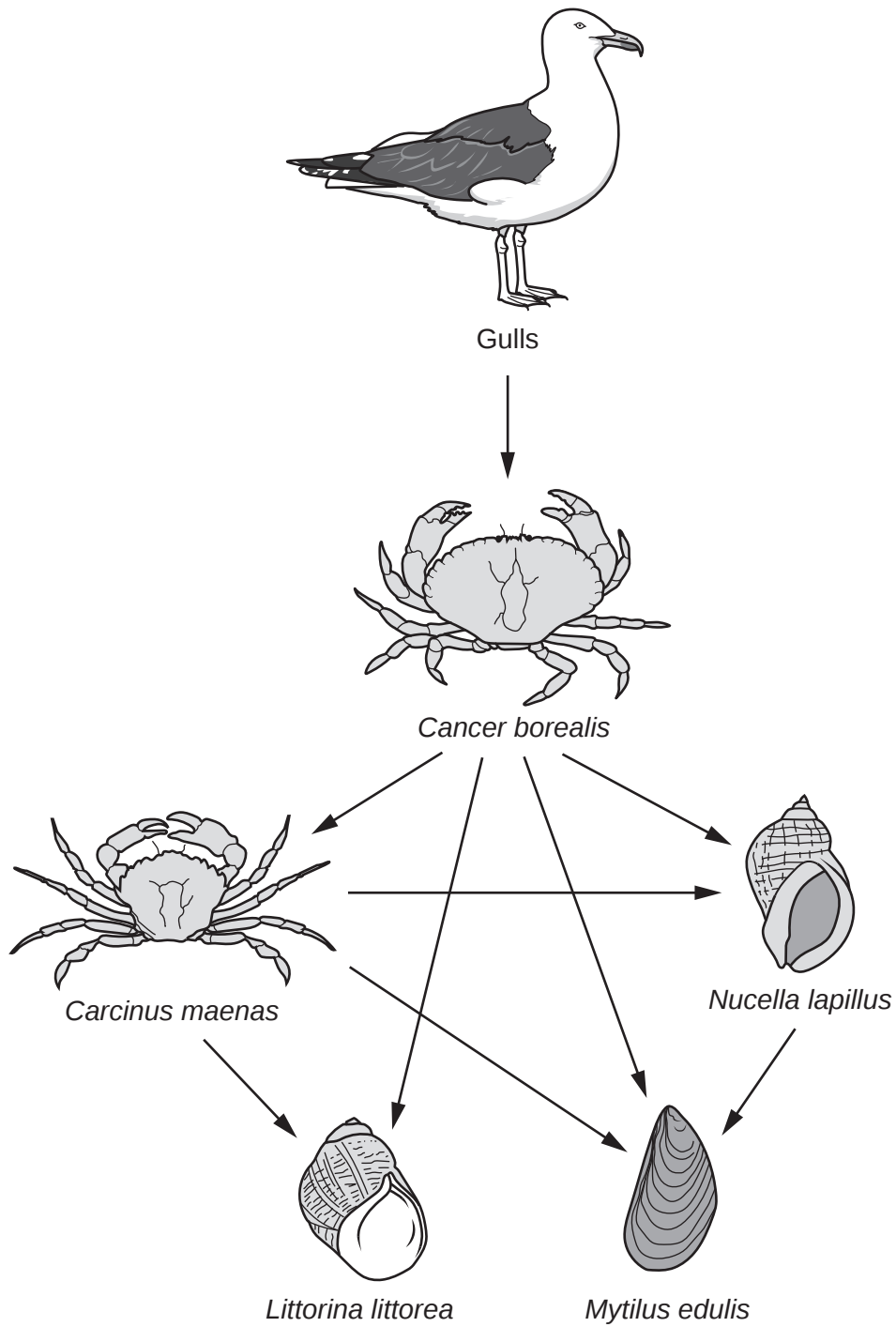


Fig. 4 – Trends in global food security from 2005 to 2020

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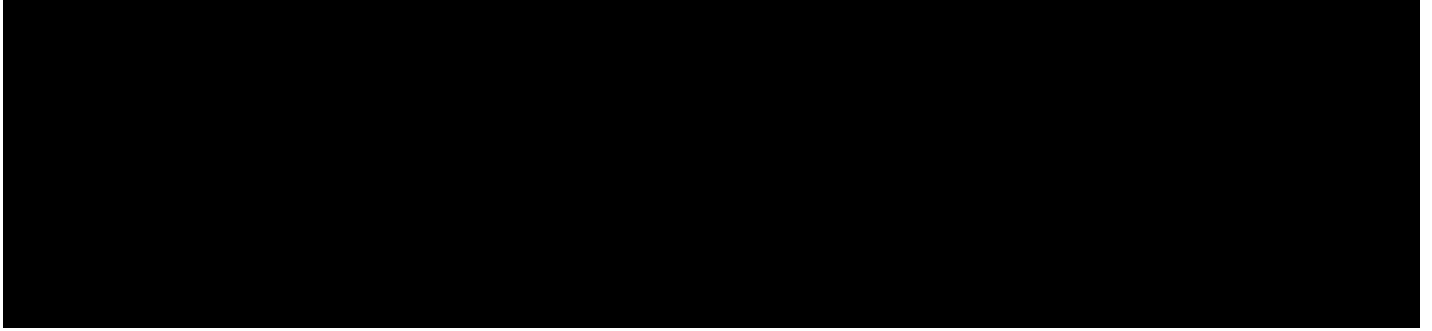
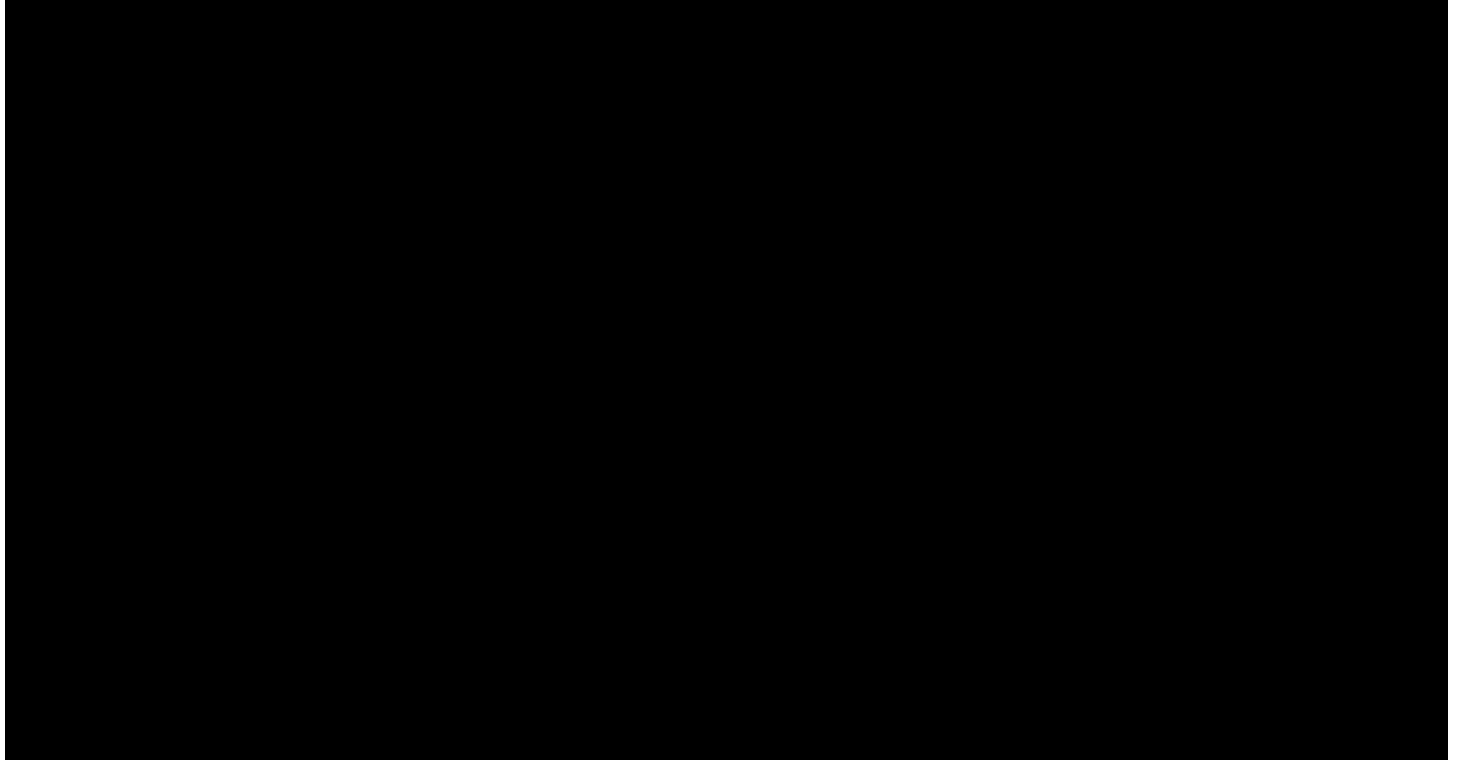


Fig. 5 – Destructive plate boundary

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
