Fig. 1 – Part of a polar marine ecosystem





Fig. 2 – Human Development Index (HDI) scores for countries of the world

Fig. 3 – Predicted urban population change from 2000 to 2050




Fig. 4 – A line graph showing climate changes between the years 1000 and 1900




Fig. 5 – An Artist's impression of global warming





Fig. 6 - Consequences of climate change
