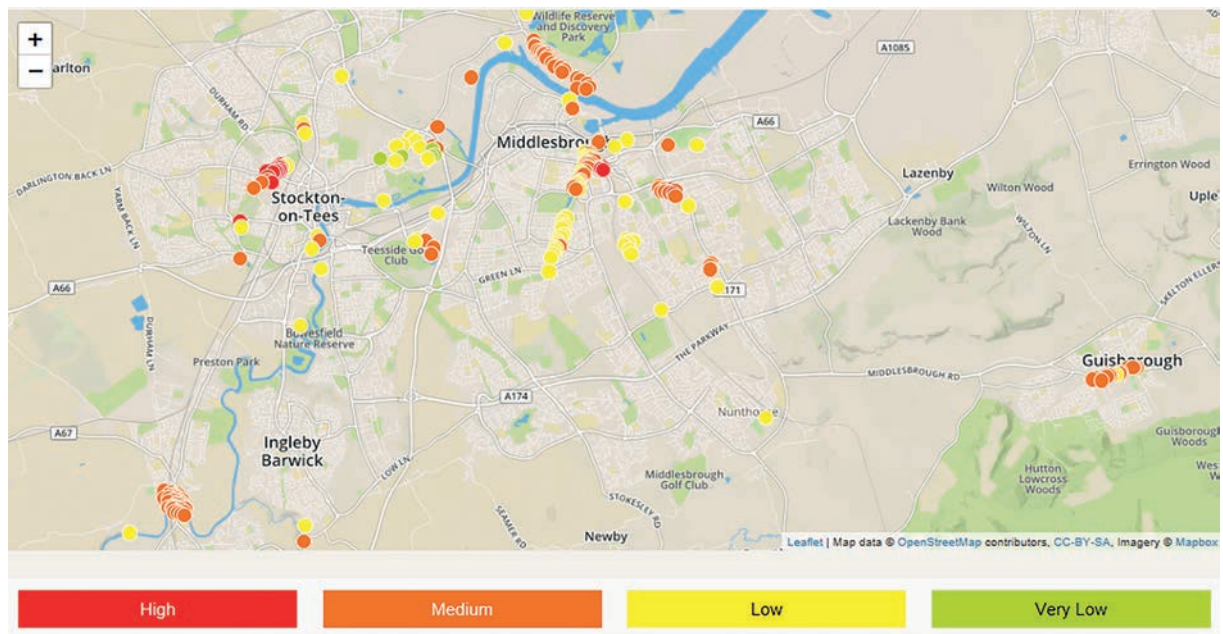


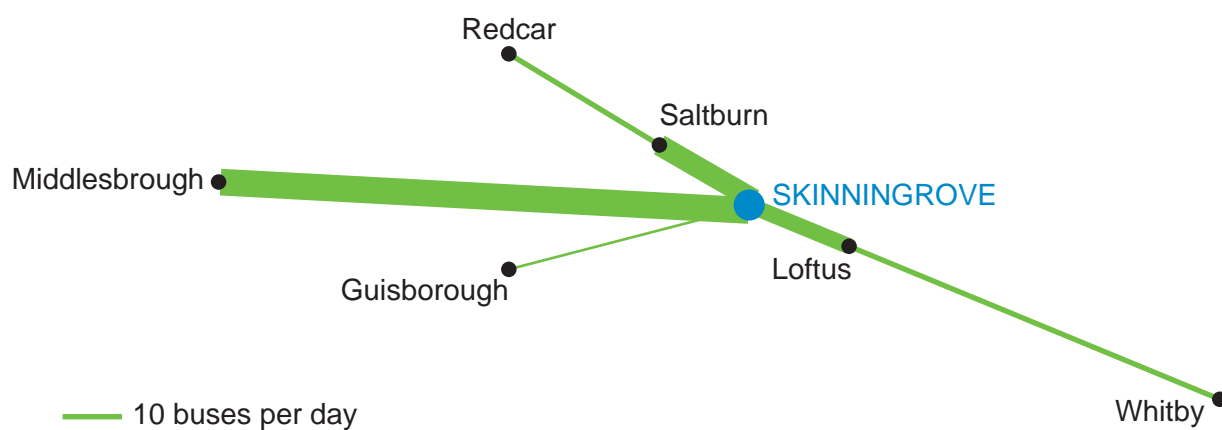
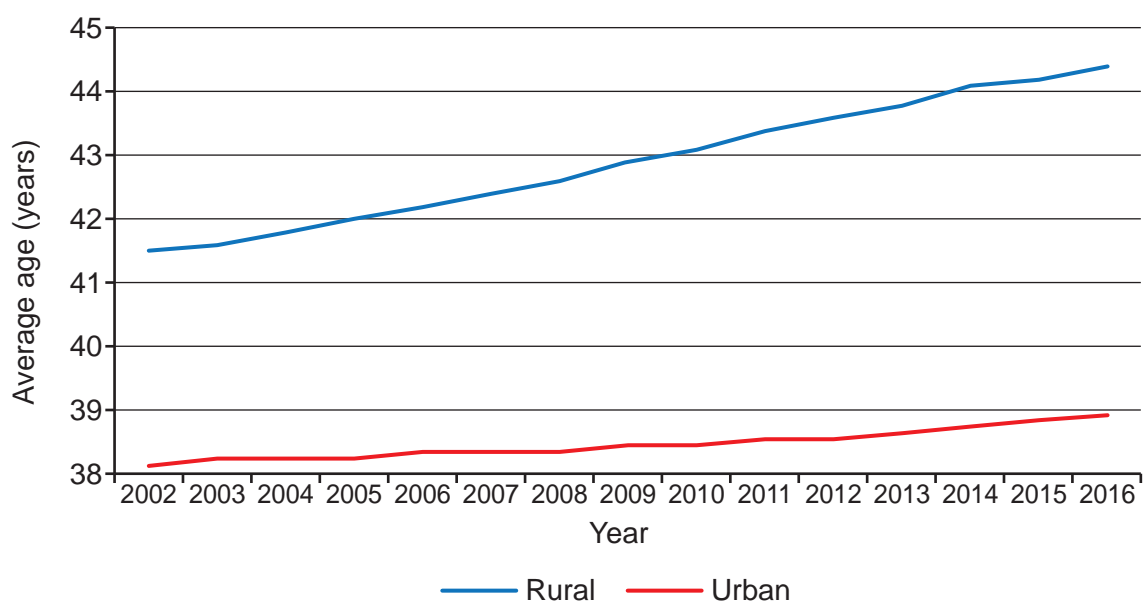
Fig. 3 – The direction and volume of buses per day to the village of Skinningrove**Fig. 4 – Average age of rural and urban UK populations, 2002–2016**

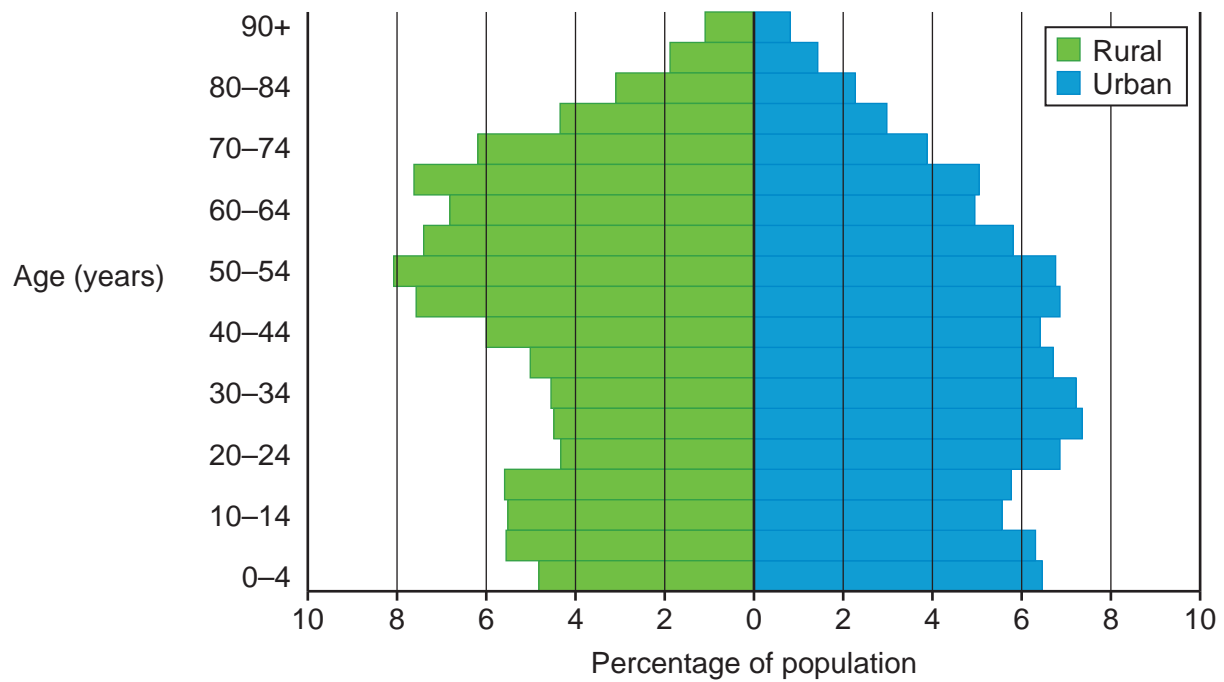
Fig. 5 – Age structure of UK urban and rural populations

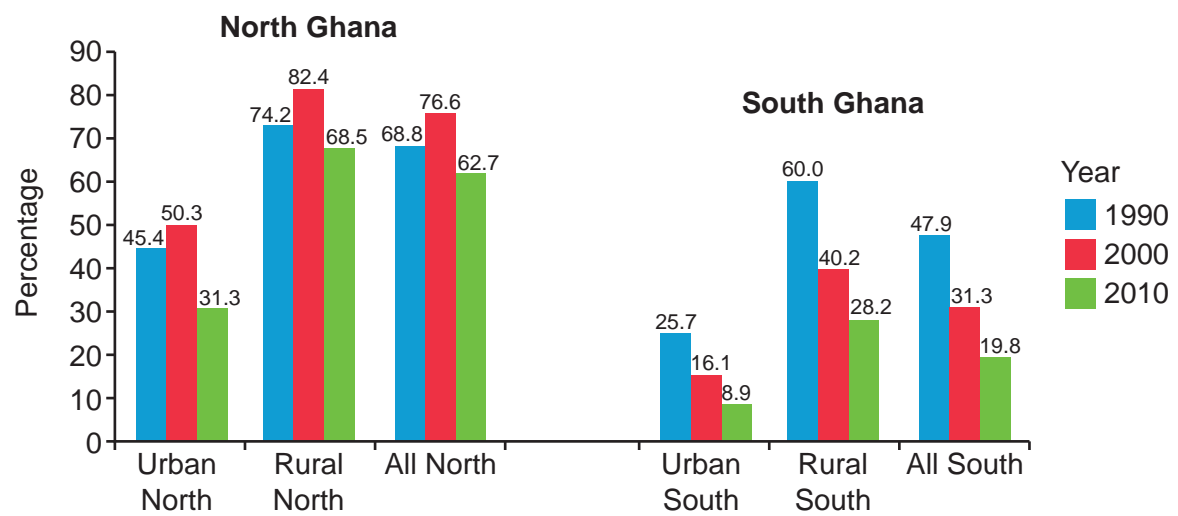
Fig. 7 – Percentage of population living in poverty in regions of Ghana, 1990–2010
