Location of ACs, EDCs and LIDCs

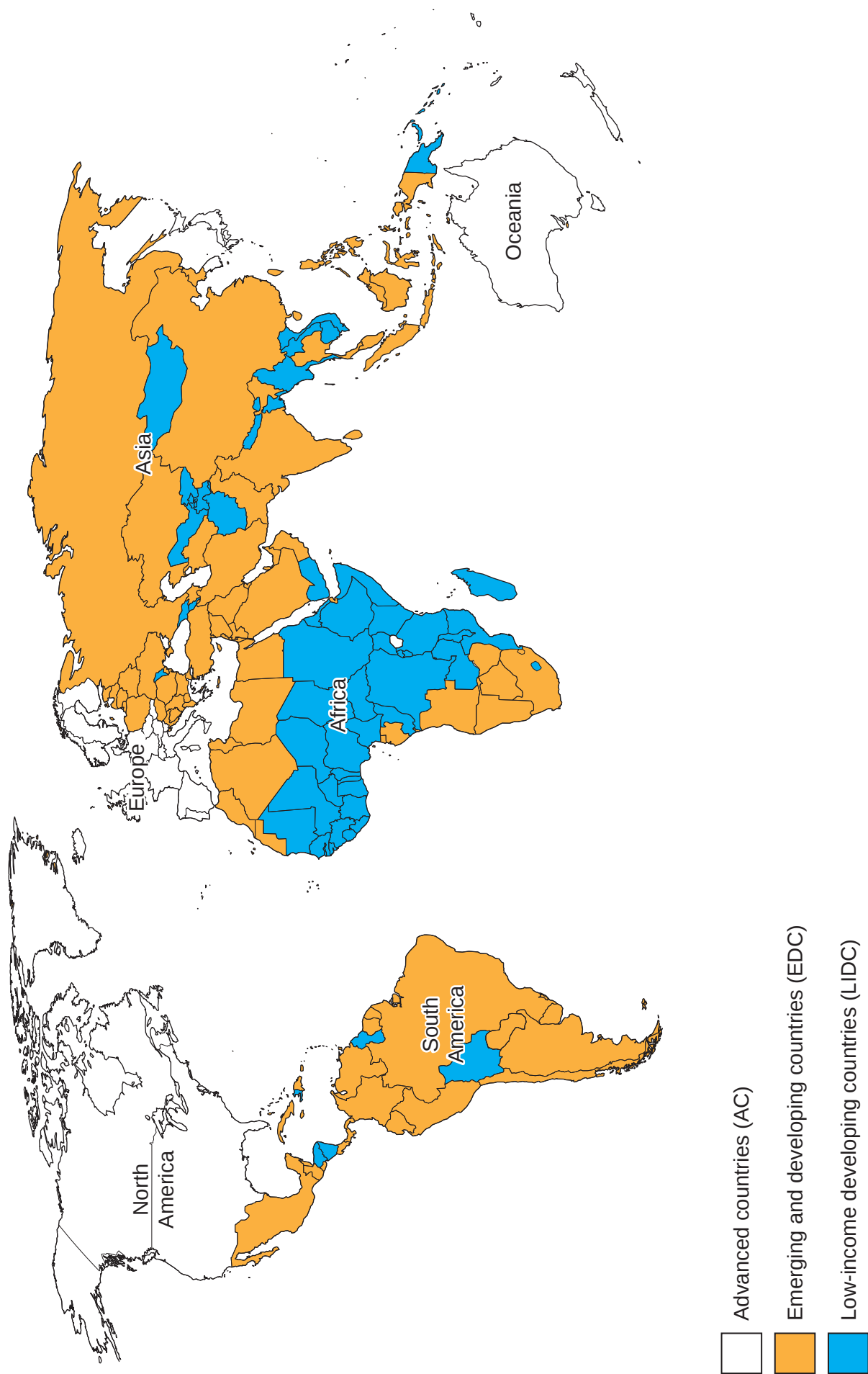

Population pyramid for the UK in 2020

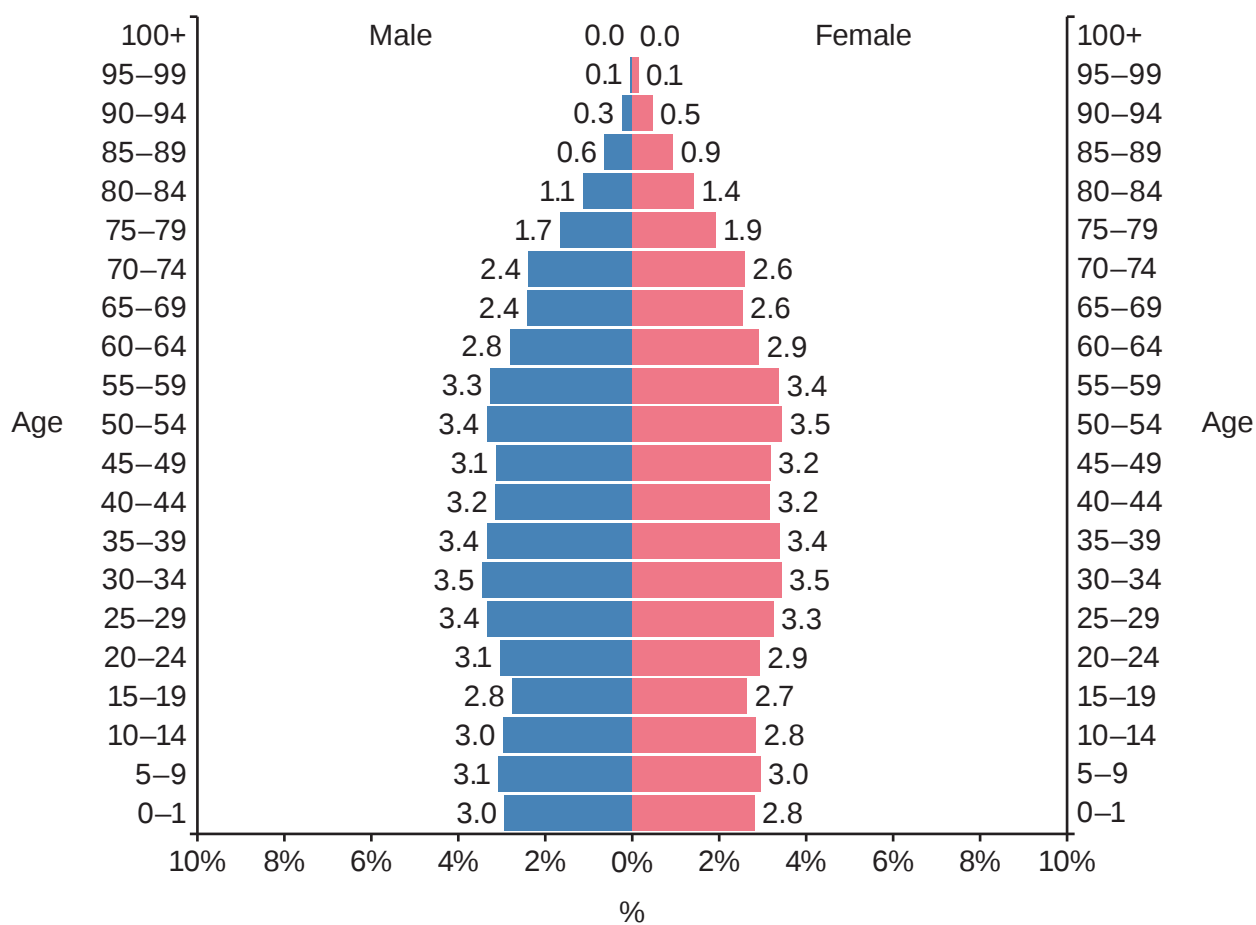

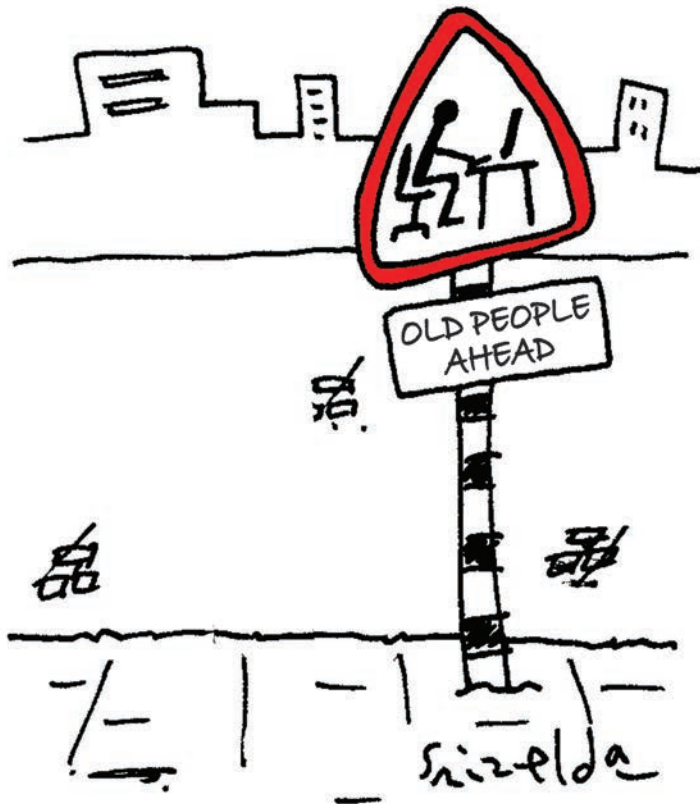

Somalia Daily Calories 1 695

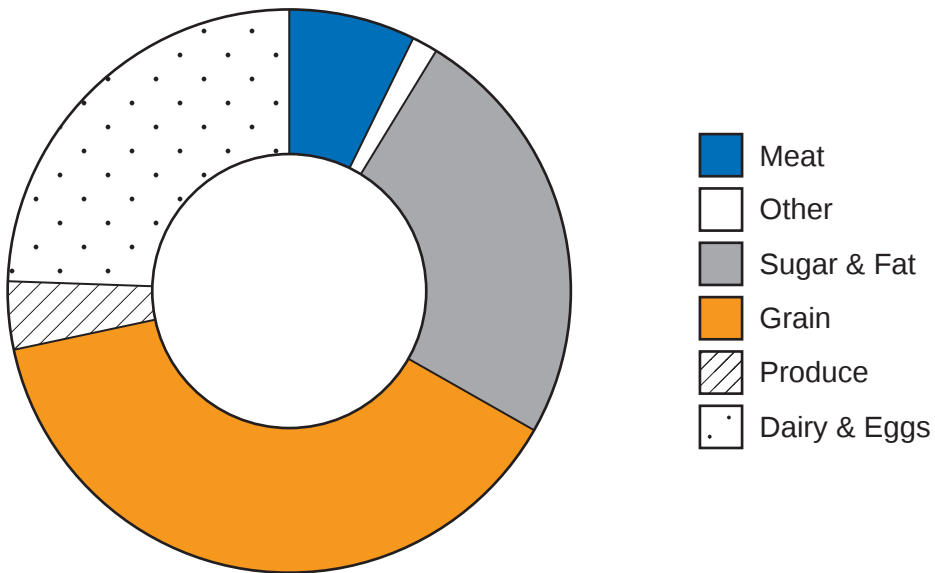
