You will have access to your fieldwork portfolio while you are answering the questions. Where you are asked to include information from your portfolio, ensure that your name, candidate number and examination centre number are written on each sheet of paper. You must not include more than five pieces of paper.

Your ability to communicate and organise your ideas will be assessed in all questions that are worth 6 or 8 marks. Your ability to write accurately will be assessed in question 1(c).

The number of marks is given in brackets [] at the end of each question or part-question.

Section A

Answer **all** questions.

It is recommended that you spend 1 hour 30 minutes on Section A.

1. This question is about your fieldwork that investigated **change over time**.

(a) Give **two** reasons why you selected your fieldwork location(s) to investigate change over time. [4]

(b) Select **one** set of primary data that you collected whilst investigating change over time.

(i) Draw a table to show this primary data. Use this table to draw **one** graph **(on page 10)** or map **(on page 12)** that best represents the data. [6]

(ii) Explain why you selected this type of graph or map to best represent your data. [4]

(c) 'Quantitative techniques involve collecting data that can be measured and recorded as numbers.'

Evaluate the quantitative techniques you used to collect your primary data whilst investigating change over time. [8]

The accuracy of your writing will be assessed in your answer to this question. [4]

Section B

Answer **all** questions.

It is recommended that you spend 1 hour on Section B.

2. This question is about your fieldwork that investigated **place**.

- (a) Analyse the patterns, trends and links shown in the primary and secondary data that you collected whilst investigating place. [6]

You may include **relevant** tables, graphs, diagrams or maps from your portfolio.

- (b) Evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of using secondary data when investigating place. [6]

- (c) Fieldwork conclusions do not always match predicted outcomes. To what extent did your conclusions from your fieldwork on place match your initial predictions? [6]

Refer to **relevant** examples of primary and secondary evidence that you collected to support your answer.
