Answer any **two** questions.

- 5 'By 1960, the USA had become a mainly suburban society.' How far do you agree? [30]
- 6 Analyse the reasons why, in 1971, President Nixon ended the gold-dollar standard established in 1945. [30]
- 7 How tolerant of social minorities were the American people in the 1980s? [30]
- 8 Assess the reasons why, after the Second World War, the USA abandoned its isolationist traditions. [30]

Depth Study 3: International History, 1945–1991

Answer any **two** questions.

- 9** To what extent was the move towards détente in the 1970s caused by fear of nuclear war? [30]
- 10** ‘Gorbachev’s reforms were responsible for the collapse of the Soviet Union.’ How far do you agree? [30]
- 11** ‘A total disaster for the people of China’. How far do you agree with this judgement on Mao Zedong’s economic policies? [30]
- 12** How consistent was the USA’s attitude towards Saddam Hussein in the period from 1980 to 1991? [30]
