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Sources for use with Section A.

Source 1: From a report to *The Times* newspaper by its reporter in Peking, 31 March 1916. *The Times* was a British newspaper. Here the reporter is commenting on the plans for new railway lines in China.

An important agreement between the Chinese Government and the Russo-Asiatic Bank was signed yesterday. The agreement provides for the construction of a railway from Harbin in Manchuria to the Chinese-Russian border, a total of 666 miles. These railway lines will enable the exploitation of very fertile river basins and promote agricultural development on a large scale. 5

This new agreement with Russia will act as a balance to the series of agreements with Japan made in October 1913, which provided for railways to be built in Eastern Mongolia and Southern Manchuria.

Harbin is situated on the navigable waters of the Sungari River. Harbin is an important junction on the Manchurian railway system. The main line from Harbin leads south to Vladivostok*. Branch lines from Harbin lead to Mukden, Peking and Korea. The new railway to be built from Harbin will put Asiatic Russia in direct communication with Northern China. 10

*Vladivostok – a warm water port on the borders of China, Russia and Korea

Source 2: From a speech by Zhou En-lai to a special conference of the Central Committee of the Communist Party, 14 January 1956. He made this speech in the year before the Hundred Flowers Campaign was publicly launched. Here he is commenting on attitudes within the Chinese Communist Party towards intellectuals.

We are building a Socialist economy to satisfy the constantly growing needs of the whole society. It is essential that we rely on the energetic labour, not only of the working class and the peasants, but also of the intellectuals. 15

At present, we do not have enough intellectuals to meet the needs of our rapid construction of a Socialist state. Some aspects of our treatment of intellectuals have been affected by our comrades who have intolerant attitudes towards those outside the Party. This has made it difficult for us to utilise fully the existing powers of intellectuals. We must act to mobilise the powers of the intellectuals to meet the growing needs of the state. 20

Firstly, we must improve the employment of intellectuals so that they can develop their specialised skills to the benefit of the state.

Secondly, intellectuals outside the Party must be trusted by us. They must be supported by us. Then they can work with real initiative. Intellectuals must be given jobs and authority; their views must be respected and the results of their professional research and work must be valued. A small number of Party members do not respect the leadership of intellectuals who have been promoted to higher positions than Party members but do not belong to the Party. This situation must be corrected. 25 30

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
