Extract 1: From E Bruce, *Napoleon & Josephine*, published in 1996.

In 1813, Napoleon did not realise how much his legendary invincibility had been weakened. His defeat in the Russian campaign encouraged resistance to him all over Napoleonic Europe. The King of Prussia made a secret alliance with the Tsar and declared war on France.

In April 1813, when Napoleon left Paris on a new campaign, he was in an optimistic mood. However, he had no idea of the strength of the hate aroused in Europe by his Imperial armies of occupation. In Prussia, the burning and pillaging across the countryside by the French soldiers, as well as the taxes and requisitioning, were creating a national movement of resistance.

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After several costly and inconclusive battles, Napoleon asked the Russian Tsar for an armistice. Austria, it was agreed would be the mediator. Napoleon was certain that his Austrian marriage links would help strengthen his position. But when Napoleon commented during discussions that, in Russia, he had sacrificed the lives of German soldiers to save his Grand Army, Metternich had to remind Napoleon that Metternich was himself German.

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Napoleon's rejection of the proposed peace terms, which would have returned France to its pre-Napoleonic natural frontiers, sealed the fate of his Empire. In August, Austria declared war and Sweden joined the Sixth Coalition. Then the princes of the Confederation of the Rhine, including his own family, abandoned Napoleon. Holland and Belgium, without waiting for the Coalition to liberate them, expelled the occupying French troops.

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Extract 2: From T Chapman, *The Congress of Vienna: Origins, process and results*, published in 1998.

After the 'Battle of the Nations' against Russia, Prussia and Austria at Leipzig in October 1813, Napoleon was forced back into France, where he found the British forces under Wellington attacking him from the south as well. This retreat, which was forced on Napoleon, was largely brought about by Russia and Britain. 25

Russia was mostly responsible for Napoleon's failure in central Europe; after 1812, Russia did not have to pursue Napoleon beyond its own frontiers but chose to do so and, in doing so, liberated central Europe. Britain, for its part, was the only country never to ally with Napoleon. It had spent more time at war with France than any other country had. Britain had contributed a small army in Spain and Portugal and, at crucial times, had used its gold to pay the wages of the armies of Napoleon's enemies. British diplomatic efforts created the coalitions against Napoleon. Above all, Britain was able to dominate the sea. 30 35

By 1814, Napoleon felt he had no choice but to abdicate and negotiate the terms of his own retirement, as well as the outline peace terms for France itself. There was no way back from his military position, as France was not only surrounded but partially occupied. France had been clearly beaten.



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
