Extract 1: From Eric Evans, *Thatcher and Thatcherism*, published 2004.

One central objective of Thatcherism was to reduce the burden of taxation. This failed, being higher in 1996 than in 1979. Characteristically, though, this strategic failure was deliberately hidden. The public recognised more the lower amounts that were taken directly from pay packets, not the higher levels of 'stealth taxes' that they paid on goods such as fuel and food. 5

Britain's relative economic decline had not been halted since 1979. Annual growth rates in the years 1979–97, although higher than the 1970s, stand out as relative failures when compared to other developed economies. The inflation rate did come down dramatically during most of the Thatcher years. However, in almost every year the British inflation rate was higher than those in other G7* countries. 10

By design, Britain became a more unequal society under Thatcher. Tax cuts for the better off were real, and the boom after 1983 did bring widespread economic benefits. Those at the bottom of society, however, failed to benefit. The numbers in poverty increased from 5 million in 1979 to 14.1 million in 1992. 15

Extract 2: From Andy McSmith, *No Such Thing as Society*, published 2011.

Sales of the great state-owned monopolies like that of British Telecom (BT) were not just a success for those who profited from these sales. Customers also liked it. Before privatisation, it could take three months for the engineer to turn up. Once BT had to compete with other telephone providers, investment in the telephone network doubled almost instantly, and prices fell. In all, the number of share owners increased from two million in 1979 to twelve million in 1989. The proportion of homes that were owner-occupied also increased, from 55 to 67 per cent. Ownership of consumer goods such as home computers, CD players, and microwave ovens also became commonplace. 20

Britain's political future was settled; people no longer talked about capitalism or its alternatives, because they expected the capitalist system to last forever. Class also seemed to disappear as a subject of political or sociological discussion. People in what had been working class occupations now owned cars and televisions and had mortgages on their properties. 25
