From Perkin Warbeck's *Proclamation to the English*, issued 1496.

From Richard, by the Grace of God, rightful King of England and Lord of Ireland

To all those who will see or read this, greeting.

At a young age, we escaped, by God's might, out of the Tower of London and were secretly taken over the sea to other countries. Henry then entered our realm, and by false means, obtained the crown that was rightfully ours. We are now armed and have, thanks be to God, the means to show ourselves to the people of England. For our mortal enemy, Henry Tudor, is a false usurper of the crown of England. The crown is ours, we know it in our heart, based upon our rights of inheritance. Henry has not only openly deprived us of our kingdom, but also, by all foul and wicked means, sought to take our life. If his tyranny extended itself only to the taking of our own life, although we have royal blood, this would cause us less grief. But this Tudor, who boasts that he has overthrown a tyrant, has ever since the first moments he usurped the throne, put into practice acts of tyranny throughout the realm.
