Source A

A French postcard, September 1914, commenting on the Battle of the Marne.

The caption was, 'The Germans retreat across the River Marne'. The largest figure in the water represents Kaiser Wilhelm. The Allied forces are on the right of the postcard.

Source A is a cartoon showing Kaiser Wilhelm falling into the River Marne.

Source B A cartoon titled 'An Important Step' published in a popular British newspaper in April 1915.

The figures behind the tree represent Turkey and Germany.

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Source B is a cartoon showing a British soldier landing in Gallipoli, with Turkey and Germany hiding behind a tree.

Source C From the diary of Denis Moriarty, an experienced sergeant in the British Army. He fought for several months at Gallipoli before the troops were evacuated.

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Source C is from a diary of a British soldier describing how hard the Gallipoli campaign was.
