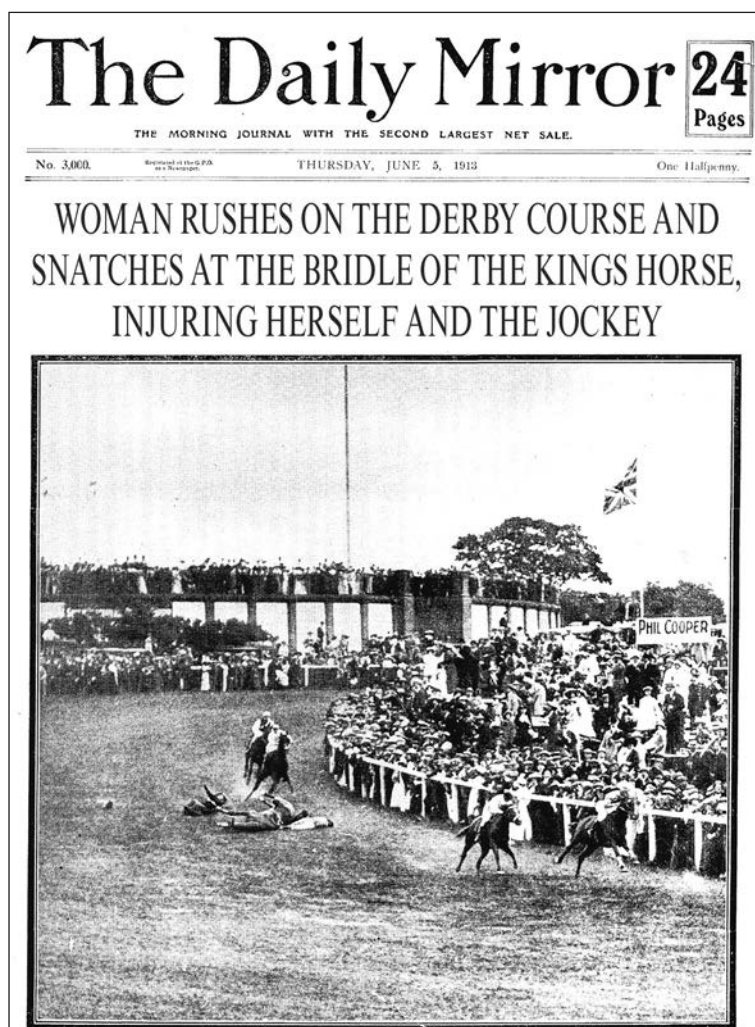

A peaceable and humane population is on the steep slope to primitive barbarism, with the instincts of hatred and blood lust which go against the very fabric of society.
