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QUESTION 2

Study Sources D and E below and answer the question which follows.

Source D

Take equal amounts of onion and garlic and pound them well together. Take equal amounts of wine and bull's blood and mix them with the onion and garlic. Put the mixture in a brass bowl and let it stand for nine nights, then strain it through a cloth. Then, about night-time, apply it to the eye with a feather.

[From the *Leechbook*, an Anglo-Saxon guide to medicine produced in the ninth century.
"Leech" is the Anglo-Saxon word for physician.]

Source E

Infection in an injury might be avoided by applying a dressing capable of destroying floating particles. I have employed carbolic acid, which is the most powerful antiseptic that we know of at the present time.

[From Joseph Lister's article 'On the Antiseptic Principle' published in the medical journal *The Lancet* in 1867]

Which of the two sources is the more reliable to an historian studying attempts to treat and cure illness and disease over time? [6]
