This question is about the growth of Chartism.

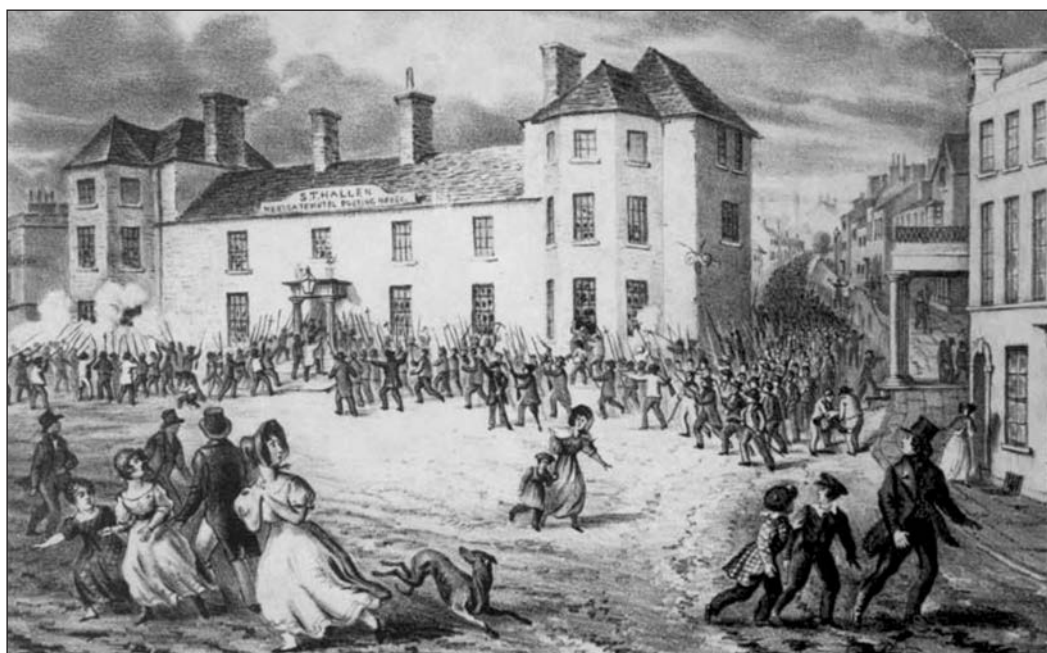
Study the sources below and then answer the question which follows.
