This question is about the importance of Lenin.

Source C

Lenin was one of the most sinister figures that ever darkened the human stage. This evil man was the founder and mainstay of Bolshevism. He was responsible for the shameful peace with Germany and the long continued terror with its thousands of innocent victims. He was indeed a revolutionary whose thirst for blood could never be quenched.

Source D

For 25 years Comrade Lenin moulded our party and trained it to be the strongest party in the world. He created the Republic of Soviets and showed the oppressed masses of the world that the rule of the landlords and capitalists is short lived. He inspired the hearts and minds of workers and peasants with the hope of freedom.
