In the scheme it is awarded for setting $\left[ax^{\frac{1}{2}} \right]_k^9 = 20$, using both limits and proceeding using correct index work to find k. It cannot be scored if $k^{\frac{1}{2}} < 0$</p> <p>A1: $k = \frac{16}{9}$</p>
