Quality of written communication does not impede communication of the science at this level. <b>(5–6 marks)</b></p> <p><b>[Level 2]</b> At least one argument for <b>and</b> one argument against is given <b>or</b> one argument for banning given, to include at least one explanation of the problem of inbreeding. Quality of written communication partly impedes communication of the science at this level. <b>(3–4 marks)</b></p> <p><b>[Level 1]</b> One argument for <b>or</b> against is given. Quality of written communication impedes communication of the science at this level. <b>(1–2 marks)</b></p> <p><b>[Level 0]</b> Insufficient or irrelevant science. Answer not worthy of credit. <b>(0 marks)</b></p>	6	<p><b>This question is targeted at grades up to A.</b></p> <p><b>Indicative scientific points at level 3 in addition to points at level 1 and 2 may include:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• (explanation of problem) reduction of gene pool</li> <li>• reduction in variation</li> <li>• accumulation of harmful recessive conditions</li> </ul> <p><b>Indicative scientific points at level 1, 2 may include:</b></p> <p>Arguments for banning breeding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• causes inbreeding</li> <li>• health problems can arise</li> <li>• it is cruel / harmful / unnatural / unethical</li> </ul> <p>Arguments against banning breeding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• health problems can be treated</li> <li>• caesarean operations are routine</li> <li>• out-breeding can be used</li> <li>• breeders should be able to do so if they wish / high demand for that breed</li> <li>• breed has been around for hundreds of years / wrong to consign the breed to extinction</li> </ul>
