Percentage of population with access to safe drinking water in 2011

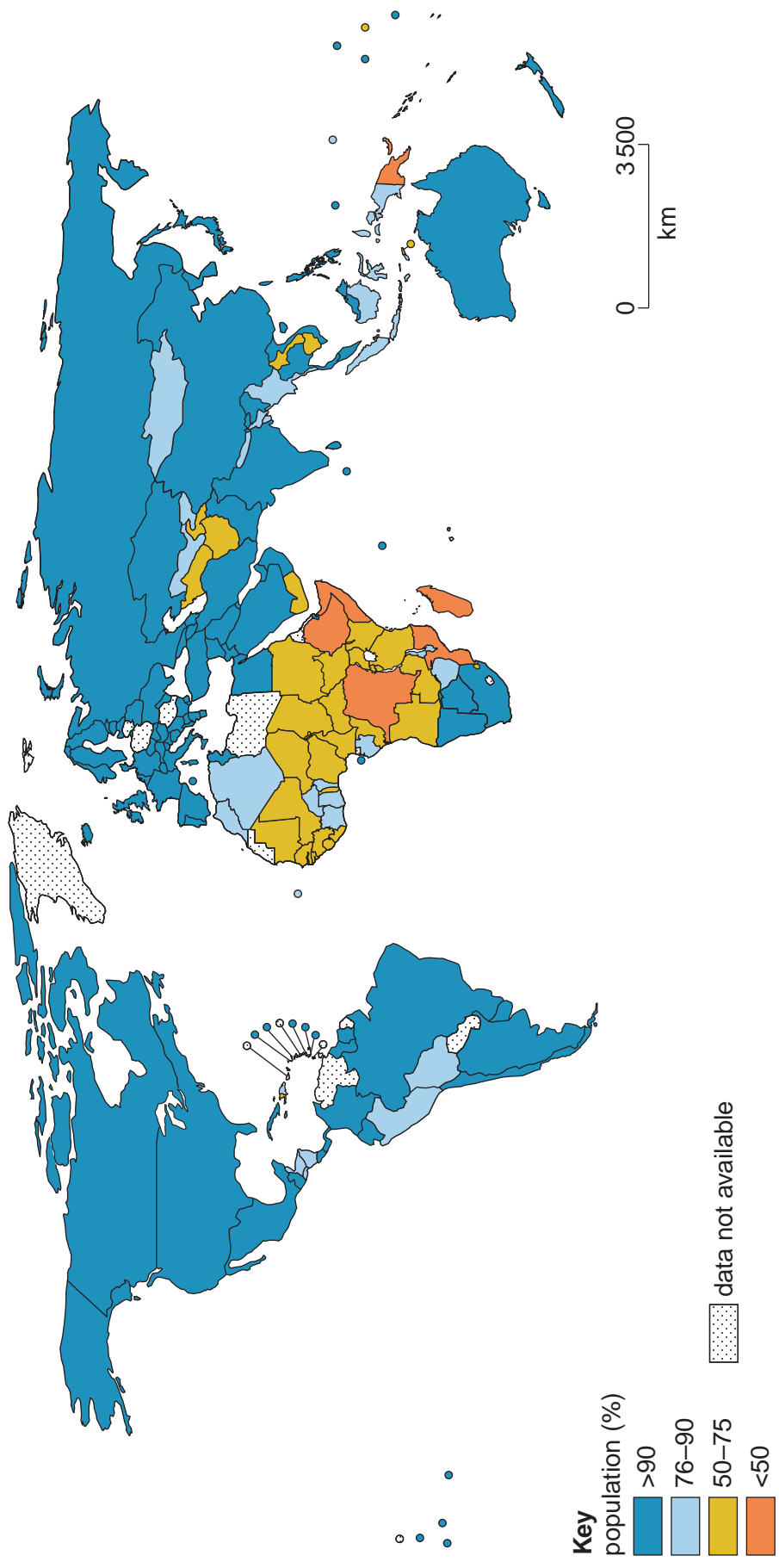

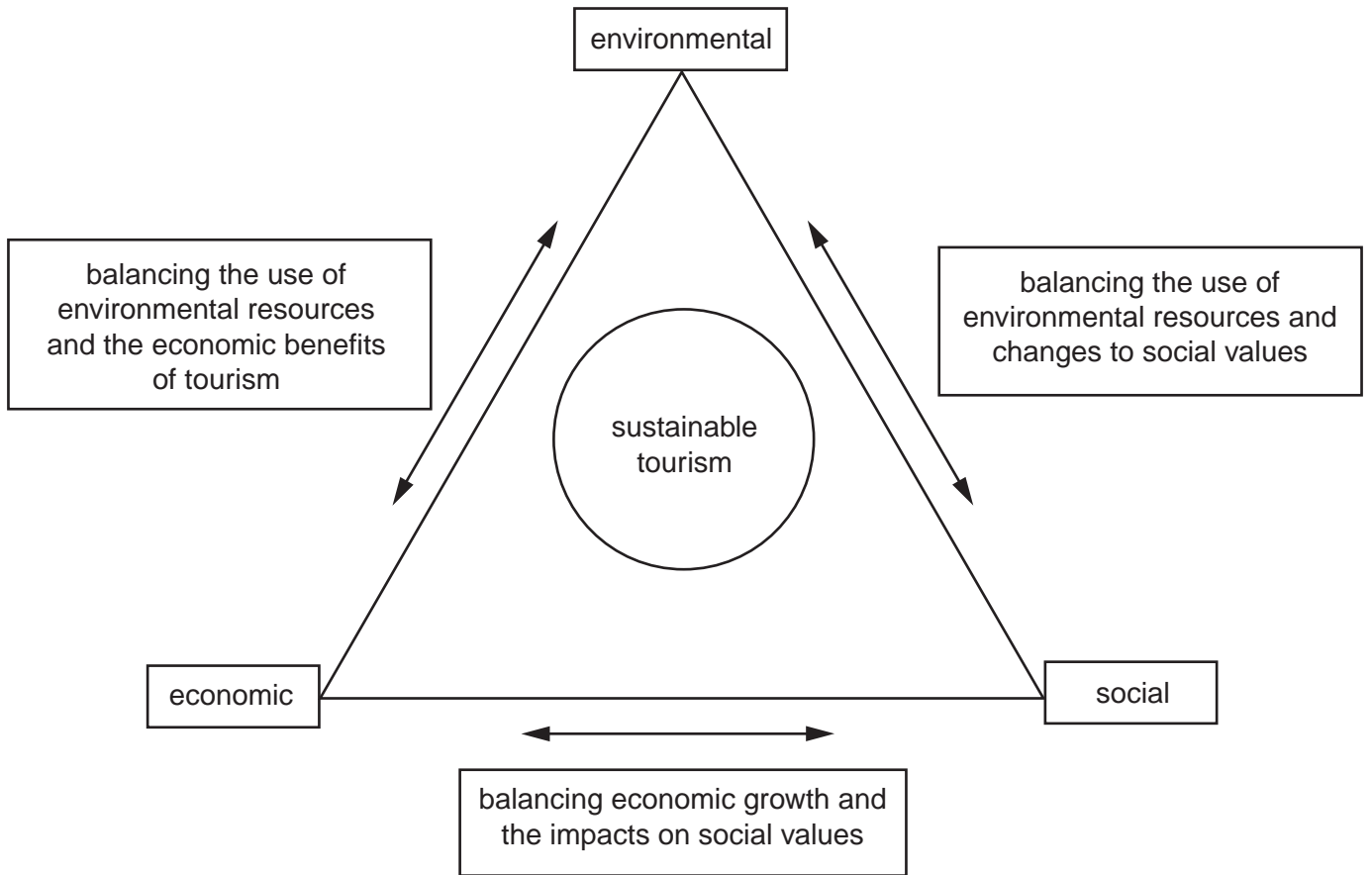
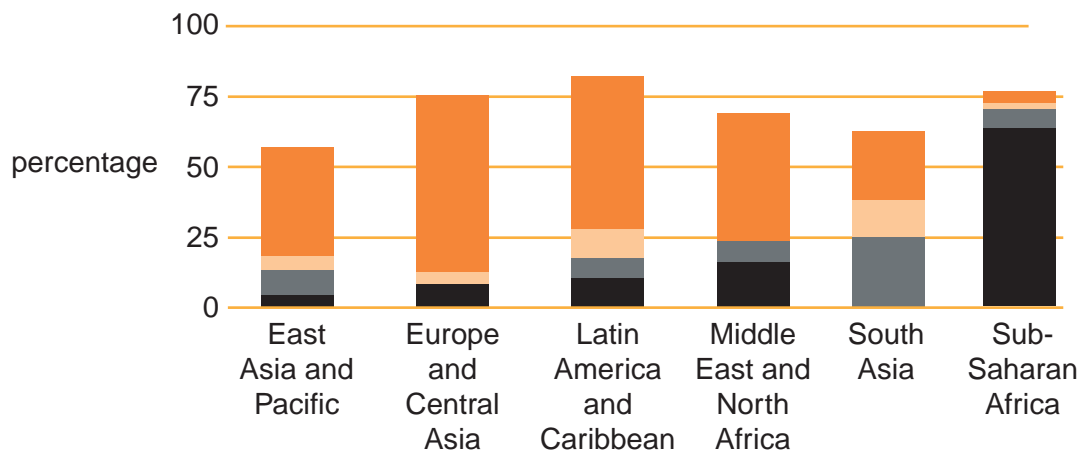
